Yersinia pestis (*Y. pestis*; formerly *Pasteurella pestis*) is a gram-negative, non-motile, coccobacillus bacterium without spores. *pestis* is a hyperparasite. Plague takes three main forms: pneumonic, septicemic, and bubonic. Flea Some species can leap 50 times their body length, a feat second only to jumps made by another group of insects, the superfamily of froghoppers. Their claws keep them from being dislodged, and their mouthparts are adapted for piercing skin and sucking blood. Adult fleas grow to about 3 millimetres (1/8 inch) long, are usually dark in color, and have bodies that are "flattened" sideways or narrow, enabling them to move through their hosts' fur or feathers. Flea larvae are worm-like, with no limbs; they have chewing mouthparts and feed on organic debris left on their hosts' skin. doi:10 Flea, the common name for the order Siphonaptera, includes 2,500 species of small flightless insects that live as external parasites of mammals and birds. 145 (3): 332-344. Amitraz in England in 1969. It is also widely used in the beekeeping industry as a control for the Varroa destructor mite, although there are reports of resistance. For the treatment of dogs Amitraz (development code BTS27419) is a non-systemic acaricide and insecticide and has also been described as a scabicide. Its effectiveness is traced back on alpha-adrenergic agonist activity, interaction with octopamine receptors of the central nervous system and inhibition of monoamine oxidases and prostaglandin synthesis. It was first synthesized by the Boots Co. Amitraz has been found to have an insect repellent effect, works as an insecticide and also as a pesticide synergist. Therefore, it leads to overexcitation and consequently paralysis and death in insects. and all development stages of ticks. Approximately 0.5% of people who are... 43234f4765 *Y. pestis* was discovered in 1894 by Alexandre Yersin, a Swiss/French physician and bacteriologist from the Pasteur Institute, during an epidemic of the plague in Hong Kong. Yersin was a member of the Pasteur school of thought. Kitasato Shibasaburō, a Japanese bacteriologist who practised Koch's methodology, was also engaged at the time in finding the causative agent of the plague. However, Yersin actually... 43234f4765 For protection against ticks and mosquito bites, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recommends DEET, icaridin (picaridin, KBR 3023), oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE), para-menthane-diol (PMD), IR3535 and 2-undecanone with the caveat that higher percentages of the active ingredient provide longer protection. 43234f4765 Amitraz is particularly effective against acarids, but it is used as a pesticide in many different fields. Therefore, amitraz is available in many different forms, such as a wettable

Rarely the disease is spread by blood transfusions. Diagnosis in the early stages is difficult. Several laboratory tests can confirm the diagnosis but treatment should be begun based on symptoms.
