Camp Douglas (Chicago) In the fall of 1862, the Union Army used the facility as a detention camp for paroled Confederate prisoners (these were Union soldiers who had been captured by the Confederacy and sent North under an agreement that they would be held temporarily while formal prisoner exchanges were worked out). It became a prisoner-of-war camp in early 1862. The Union Army first used the camp in 1861 as an organizational and training camp for volunteer regiments. Camp Douglas, in Chicago, Illinois was one of the largest Union Army prisoner-of-war camps for Confederate soldiers taken prisoner during the American Camp Douglas, in Chicago, Illinois was one of the largest Union Army prisoner-of-war camps for Confederate soldiers taken prisoner during the American Civil War. Later in 1862 the Union Army again used Camp Douglas as a training camp. Although not alone in this distinction, it is sometimes described as "The North's Andersonville. Camp Douglas became a permanent prisoner-of-war camp from January 1863 to the end of the war in May 1865.
