Bipolar I disorder Typically, manic episodes can last at least 7 days for most of each day to the extent that the individual may need medical attention, while the depressive episodes last at least 2 weeks. People may also have one or more depressive episodes. Symptoms of bipolar I disorder typically begin at age 15–25 years of age, with depression being the most common initial symptom. The prevalence of bipolar disorders is about 1% worldwide. During mania, an individual behaves or feels abnormally energetic, happy, or irritable, and often makes impulsive and reckless decisions. The average age of onset of PBD remains unclear; reported ages range from 5 to 19 years old. PBD is typically more severe and has a poorer prognosis than cases of bipolar disorder... 030067c9de Evidence also suggests that lithium, in particular, reduces the risk of suicide in patients with mood disorders, making it a unique therapeutic option among mood stabilizers. 030067c9de

They are also prescribed for the bipolar type of schizoaffective disorder, and in some cases are used as adjuncts for treatment-resistant major depressive disorder. In addition, certain mood stabilizers have been shown to reduce impulsivity and aggression in selected psychiatric and neurological conditions. 030067c9de The disorder is often underdiagnosed due to its hypomanic episodes not being as disruptive as the full mania seen in Bipolar I. Bipolar II tends to be chronic and can significantly impact a person's social, professional, and emotional life. Though the causes are not fully understood, a combination of genetic, environmental, and neurobiological factors is believed to play a role. 030067c9de

PBD has been proposed as an explanation for periods of extreme mood swings, called mood episodes. These episodes alternate between depression or irritability and highly elevated moods, called manic or hypomanic episodes. Mixed mood episodes can occur when someone with PBD experiences depressive and manic symptoms simultaneously. PBD mood episodes differ from general mood swings experienced by children and adolescents, as mood episodes may persist over an extended period of several weeks or years, and may cause severe disruptions to an individual's life. 030067c9de abnormally elevated mood, such as mania or hypomania 030067c9de BD-NOS is a mood disorder and one of four subtypes on the bipolar spectrum, which also includes bipolar I disorder, bipolar II disorder, and cyclothymia. BD-NOS was a classification in the DSM-IV and has since been changed to Bipolar "Other Specified" and "Unspecified" in the 2013 released DSM-5 (American Psychiatric Association, 2013). Bipolar II disorder Diagnosis for BP-II requires that the individual must never have experienced a full manic episode. Otherwise, one manic episode meets the criteria for bipolar I disorder (BP-I). Hypomanic episodes, major depressive episodes, and psychotic features may also be present but are not necessary for diagnosis. 030067c9de several subtypes of depressive disorders or psychiatric syndromes featuring less severe symptoms such as dysthymic disorder (similar to MDD, but longer lasting and more persistent, though often milder) and cyclothymic disorder (similar to but milder than BD). 030067c9de The mechanisms of this mood disorder are not clearly understood, although some studies suggest areas for future clinical research. Structural and functional MRI studies have shown differences in brain regions in BD, such as regions involved in perceiving risk-reward and regulating emotions.
