== Life and career == b34d07698d José Luis Sáenz de Heredia was the fourth of the seven children born to the Venezuelan Nieves Osío y Espar and the Riojan Ángel Sáenz de Heredia y Suárez-Argudín. He came from an aristocratic family closely connected to politics, as he was a first cousin of José Antonio Primo de Rivera y Sáenz de Heredia, the founder of the Falange, and thus a nephew of General Miguel Primo de Rivera. b34d07698d The movement emerged alongside Chicha music and the mass migration from Peru's Andean highlands and central forest to coastal cities. Created as promotional posters for cumbia concerts using hand-drawn screen printing techniques, the style is characterized by phosphorescent and fluorescent colors, contrasting tones against black backgrounds. b34d07698d Speakers of both Guaraní and Spanish typically employ a great deal of code-switching between the two languages, hence why the blending of the two languages is called "Jopara", meaning 'mixture'. The relative amount of Guaraní or Spanish used in speech varies depending upon the birth of the speakers, the place where they speak, with whom they are speaking, the topic of discussion, and how they want their meaning to be interpreted. Generally, the rural and older population tends to use more Guaraní, while the urban and younger population uses more Spanish—the rural and older population understands more Guaraní and the urban and younger more Spanish. General and everyday conversation is often suited to Guaraní, while technical and specific or formal conversation is often suited for Spanish. b34d07698d The investigation by the police had the Spanish society of the time on tenterhooks.
