

How Long Does A Nit Take To Hatch

Bovicola ovis every three days. Adults gain brown stripes swathed across their body. Lice *Bovicola ovis*, the sheep body louse, is a chewing louse that afflicts sheep across the world. 5 to 2 millimeters (0.06 to 0.2 inches). The eggs hatch and the cycle repeats. It belongs to the order Phthiraptera, the parvorder Trichodectera, and the genus *Bovicola*. It spreads from sheep to sheep via direct contact of fleeces, and lives on their skin and wool. As obligate parasites, lice do not survive long anywhere other than a sheep body. Males generally live longer (0.8 inches) across as adults. It does not pierce the skin to drink blood; rather, it feeds on hair and oil secretions, loose skin flakes, and epidermal debris at the base of the wool. Lice are small, measuring just 1 mm. After one to three weeks, females become infertile and die. They generally have a reddish-brown head and a pale cream-colored or yellow-colored body.

A second, much more recent "NIT" tournament is played in November and known as the NIT Season Tip-Off. Infested sheep are irritated by the lice and will attempt to scratch their itching fleece, damaging it. While infested sheep will not generally be at risk of severe health complications, an infestation reduces both wool yield and value.

Body lice are disease vectors and can transmit pathogens that cause human diseases such as epidemic typhus, trench fever, and relapsing fever. In developed countries, infestations are only a problem in areas of poverty where there is poor body hygiene, crowded living conditions, and a lack of access to clean clothing. Outbreaks can also occur in situations where large groups of people are forced to live in unsanitary conditions. These types of outbreaks are seen globally in prisons, homeless populations, refugees of war, or when natural disasters occur and proper sanitation is not available. == Classification == Lice differ from other hematophagous ectoparasites such as fleas in spending their entire lifecycle on a host. Head lice cannot fly, and their short, stumpy legs render them incapable of jumping, or even walking efficiently on flat surfaces. == Background == Lice are obligate parasites, living externally on warm-blooded hosts, which include most species of bird and mammal, notably excluding monotremes, pangolins, bats, sirenians, tapirs, rhinoceroses, and members of the clade and suborder Whippomorpha (Cetaceans and Hippopotamids). Chewing lice live among the hairs or feathers of their host and feed on skin and debris, whereas sucking lice pierce the host's skin and feed on blood and other secretions. They usually spend their whole life on a single host, cementing their eggs, called nits, to hairs or feathers. The eggs hatch into nymphs, which moult three times before becoming fully grown, a process that takes about four weeks.
