Environmental psychology Environmental psychology is a branch of psychology that explores the relationship between humans and the external world. Another important research area within environmental psychology is the study of humans' influences on the environment, that is, psychological factors influencing pro-environmental behavior and different ways it can be possible to encourage environmentally friendly behaviors, in order to mitigate climate change and biodiversity loss. Environmental psychology investigates how humans change the environment and how the environment influences humans' experiences and behaviors. The quality and nature of the relationship depend on the interactions between individuals, and is derived from the unique context and history that builds between people over time.
