The upper border of the flexor retinaculum corresponds to the distal (lower) transverse skin crease in front of the wrist and is continuous with the deep fascia of the forearm. The lower border is attached to the palmar aponeurosis.

== Factors influencing the choice ==

In terms of the signs/symptoms of ulnar neuropathy trauma and pressure to the arm and wrist, especially the elbow, the medial side of the wrist, and other sites close to the course of the ulnar nerve are of interest in this condition. Many people complain of sensory changes in the fourth and fifth digits. Rarely, an individual actually notices that the unusual sensations are mainly in the medial side of the ring finger (fourth digit). Sometimes the third digit is also involved, especially on the ulnar (medial) side. The sensory changes can be a feeling of numbness or a tingling, pain rarely occurs in the hand. Complaints of pain tend to be more common in the arm, up to and including the elbow area, which is probably the most common site of pain in an ulnar neuropathy.

The medial epicondyle protects the ulnar nerve, which runs in a groove on the back of this epicondyle. The ulnar nerve is vulnerable because it passes close to the surface along the back of the bone. Striking the medial epicondyle causes a tingling...

ASMR ASMR is a subjective experience of "low-grade euphoria" characterized by "a combination of positive feelings and a distinct static-like tingling sensation on the skin". It attaches to the bones near the radius and ulna. On the ulnar side, the flexor retinaculum attaches to the pisiform bone and the hook of the hamate bone. On the radial side, it attaches to the tubercle of the scaphoid bone, and to the medial part of the palmar surface and the tubercle of the trapezium bone. f960e247fa The word "humerus" is derived from Late Latin humerus, from Latin umerus, meaning upper arm, shoulder, and is linguistically related to Gothic ams (shoulder) and Greek ōmos. f960e247fa Positioning normally occurs after the administration of anesthesia. f960e247fa The term can also refer to media (usually audiovisual) meant to evoke this phenomenon, with the sensation itself being informally referred to as "tingles". f960e247fa The median nerve is the only nerve that passes through the carpal tunnel. Ulnar neuropathy At the wrist a similar neuropathy is ulnar tunnel syndrome. Ulnar neuropathy may be caused by entrapment of the ulnar nerve with resultant numbness and tingling. Ulnar neuropathy may affect the elbow as cubital tunnel syndrome. It may also cause weakness or paralysis of the muscles supplied by the nerve. a feeling of numbness or a tingling, pain rarely occurs in the hand. The lower extremity consists of 2 epicondyles, 2 processes (trochlea and capitulum), and 3 fossae (radial fossa, coronoid fossa, and olecranon fossa) f960e247fa

== Etymology == f960e247fa The median nerve originates from the lateral and medial cords of the brachial plexus, and has contributions from ventral roots of C6-C7 (lateral cord) and C8 and T1 (medial cord). f960e247fa In September 1988, Dravecky was diagnosed with a desmoid tumor in his left arm. He underwent surgery the following month. Dravecky returned to pitch for the Giants in August 1989 and won his first major league start of the season. In his second start, he broke his arm throwing a pitch. He retired from baseball after the season and, following a cancer recurrence, had his left arm amputated in 1991. f960e247fa

Musculocutaneous nerve compression of musculocutaneous nerve. It provides motor innervation to the muscles of the anterior compartment of the arm: the coracobrachialis, biceps brachii, and brachialis. It arises opposite the lower border of the pectoralis minor. Those who have it, can complain of pain, tingling or reduced sensation over the lateral side of the forearm. It courses through the anterior part of the arm, terminating 2 cm above elbow; after passing the lateral edge of the tendon of biceps brachii it becomes known as the lateral cutaneous nerve of the forearm. It provides sensory innervation to the lateral forearm (via its terminal branch). This symptom The musculocutaneous nerve is a mixed branch of the lateral cord of the brachial plexus derived from cervical spinal nerves C5-C7 f960e247fa

The medial epicondyle gives attachment to the ulnar collateral ligament of elbow joint, to the pronator teres, and to a common tendon of origin (the common flexor tendon) of some of the flexor muscles of the forearm: the flexor carpi radialis, the flexor carpi ulnaris, the flexor digitorum superficialis, and the palmaris longus. The medial epicondyle is located on the distal end of the humerus. Additionally, the medial epicondyle is inferior to the medial supracondylar ridge. It is also proximal to the olecranon fossa. f960e247fa

Medial epicondyle of the humerus along the back of the bone. This response is known as striking the "funny bone" The medial epicondyle of the humerus is an epicondyle of the humerus bone of the upper arm in humans. It is larger and more prominent than the lateral epicondyle and is directed slightly more posteriorly in the anatomical position. Striking the medial epicondyle causes a tingling sensation in the ulnar nerve. In comparative anatomy, the more neutral term entepicondyle is used. In birds, where the arm is somewhat rotated compared to other tetrapods, it is called the ventral epicondyle of the humerus f960e247fa
