There are two main categories of respirators: the air-purifying respirator, in which respirable air is obtained by filtering a contaminated atmosphere, and the air-supplied respirator, in which an alternate supply of breathable air is delivered 8c56a4797b

The substrate consists of many carbon granules, each of which is highly porous. Consequently, the substrate possesses a large surface area that can trap contaminants. Activated carbon is typically used in filters because it has been treated to have a significantly higher surface area than untreated carbon. One gram of activated carbon has a surface area exceeding 3,000 m² (32,000 sq ft). 8c56a4797b Airborne toxic materials may be gaseous (for example, chlorine or mustard gas), or particulates (such as biological agents). Patent protection on the basic Trinitron design ran out in 1996, and it quickly faced a number of competitors at much lower prices. The company then designed and shifted to flatscreen tubes, named FD Trinitron, before the industry shifted to LCD panels. Sony ended production from Japanese plants in 2004, and stopped selling them in the United States

and Canada in 2006. Sony continued to sell Trinitrons in China, India, and regions of South America using tubes delivered from their Singapore plant until it ended production in March 2008. A total of 280 million units were built by the time when Trinitron production concluded. 8c56a4797b Elastomeric respirators consist of a reusable mask that seals to the face, with exchangeable filters. Elastomeric respirators can be used with chemical cartridge filters that remove gases, mechanical filters that retain particulate matter, or both.
