Whether a work is eligible to copyright, and if so, for how long that copyright exists, is governed by the laws of the country where copyright on the work is claimed. The Berne Convention and also the UCC define only the minimum requirements for copyrights that all signatory countries must meet, but any country is free to go beyond this minimal common denominator in its legislation. Short-term memory Not Short-term memory (or "primary" or "active memory") is the capacity for holding

a small amount of information in an active, readily available state for a short interval. In contrast, long-term memory holds information indefinitely. The commonly cited capacity of 7 items, found in Miller's law, has been superseded by 3-5 items. The duration of short-term memory (absent rehearsal or active maintenance) is estimated to be on the order of seconds. long-term recall (semantic similarity). For example, short-term memory holds a phone number that has just been recited. Together, these findings show that long-term memory and short-term memory can vary independently of each other db1adf834b

Benzodiazepines are generally effective when used therapeutically in the short term, but even then the risk of dependency can be significantly high. There are significant physical, mental and social risks associated with the long-term use of benzodiazepines. Not everyone, however, experiences problems with long-term use.
