The genus name *Paradisornis* combines the Ancient Greek *paradeisos* meaning "paradise" with *ornis* meaning "bird". The specific epithet *rudolphi* was chosen to honour Archduke Rudolf Franz Karl Joseph, the Crown-Prince of Austria. 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Like many of the species in the genus *Eulemur*, the blue-eyed black lemur is sexually dichromatic. Males are solid black in color, with the hairs sometimes tinged brown at the roots. Females are reddish-brown in color with their underside and outline of their face a lighter tan. They have a dark brown or gray muzzle and the back of their hands and feet are a similar dark color. Both sexes have blue eyes, hence the common name, and are one of the only primates other than humans to consistently have blue eyes. They are also sometimes called Archangel Blues. It is believed that sailors took them from the Archangel Isles to Great Britain and Northern Europe in the 1860s. The first reference to an Archangel Cat appears in British print in 1862. The first recorded appearance of one in a show was in 1872 at The Crystal Palace in England as the Archangel Cat.
