In 2020, 1.34% of births took place outside of a hospital in California, USA, where 1 out of 8 births in the country happen. Most of the out-of-hospital births are planned, and thus, not considered an emergency childbirth. However, about 12% of attempted home deliveries need urgent transport to a hospital. Infant A newborn is, in mainstream use, a baby who is only hours, days, or weeks old; while in medical contexts, a newborn or neonate (from Latin *neonātus* 'newborn') is an infant in the first 28 days after birth (the term applies to premature, full term, and postmature infants). The terms may also be used to refer to juveniles of other organisms. Elimination communication families' reliance on diapers, this helps reduce the environmental impact of discarding disposable diapers and/or washing cloth diapers, and saves families Elimination communication (EC) is a practice in which a caregiver uses timing, signals, cues, and intuition to address an infant's need to eliminate waste. The practice can be done full-time, part-time, or just occasionally. a toilet). The term "elimination communication" was inspired by traditional practices of diaperless baby care in less industrialized countries and hunter-gatherer cultures. g. Caregivers may use diapers (nappies) as a back-up in case of "misses" some or all of the time, or not at all. Some practitioners of EC begin soon after birth, the optimum window being zero to four months in terms of helping the baby get in tune with their elimination needs, although it can be started with babies of any age. EC emphasizes communication between the caregiver and child, helping them both become more attuned to the child's innate rhythms and control of urination and defecation. Caregivers try to recognize and respond to babies' bodily needs and enable them to urinate and defecate in an appropriate place (e 50d238ba80

== Other uses == 50d238ba80 IRDS affects about 1% of newborns and is the leading cause of morbidity and mortality in preterm infants. Data have shown the choice of elective caesarean sections to strikingly increase the incidence of respiratory distress in term infants; dating back to 1995, the UK first documented 2,000 annual caesarean section births requiring neonatal admission for respiratory distress. The incidence decreases with advancing gestational age, from about 50% in babies born at 26–28 weeks to about 25% at 30–31 weeks. The syndrome is more frequent in males, Caucasians, infants of diabetic mothers and the second-born of premature twins. 50d238ba80 Emergency childbirth can follow the same steps as a planned childbirth. There are two types of NAS: prenatal and postnatal. Prenatal NAS is caused by discontinuation of drugs taken by the pregnant parent, while postnatal NAS is caused by discontinuation of drugs directly to the infant. 50d238ba80 Baby2Baby reaches over one million children in all 50 states and has requests for 1.5 billion diapers from the families they serve. Neonatal intensive care unit The NICU is divided into several areas, including a critical care area for babies who require close monitoring and intervention, an intermediate care area for infants who are stable but still require specialized care, and a step down unit where babies who are ready to leave the hospital can receive additional care before being discharged. an intensive care nursery (ICN), is an intensive care unit (ICU) specializing in the care of ill or premature newborn infants. the care of ill or premature newborn infants. Those diagnosed with NAS may exhibit signs and symptoms that vary depending on the type of drugs used by the parent, how long the drugs were used, the amount of drug used that made it to the child, and symptoms associated with premature birth. Symptoms can appear as soon as 24 to 48 hours and as late as 5 to 10 days after birth. If the neonate (a newborn less than 4 weeks of age) is expected to have NAS, they may need to stay in the hospital to be monitored for a week. Neonatal withdrawal A baby born at Neonatal withdrawal, neonatal abstinence syndrome (NAS) or neonatal opioid withdrawal syndrome (NOWS) is a drug withdrawal syndrome of infants, caused by the cessation of the administration of drugs which may or may not be licit. the neonate (a newborn less than 4 weeks of age) is expected to have NAS, they may need to stay in the hospital to be monitored for a week. Tolerance, dependence, and withdrawal may occur as a result of repeated administration of drugs, or after short-term high-dose use—for example, during mechanical ventilation in intensive care units 50d238ba80

Latch (breastfeeding) In a good latch, both the nipple and a large portion of the areola are in the baby's mouth. A good latch promotes high milk flow and minimizes nipple discomfort for the mother, whereas poor latch results in poor milk transfer to the baby and can quickly lead to sore and cracked nipples. Neonatology Neonatal care often involves a multidisciplinary team to provide intensive monitoring, respiratory and nutritional support, neonatal resuscitation and transport, and support for families facing complex medical decisions.
