

What Does Tinnitus Sound Like

The Hum diagnosis of tinnitus, a self-reported disturbance of the auditory system, is used by some physicians in response to complaints about the Hum. They are sometimes named according to the locality where the problem has been particularly publicized, such as the "Taos Hum" in New Mexico and the "Windsor Hum" in Ontario. The ear may be affected by disease, including infection and traumatic damage. Diseases of the ear may lead to hearing loss, tinnitus and balance disorders such as vertigo, although many of these conditions may also be affected by damage to the brain or neural pathways leading from the ear.

The Hum does not appear to be a single phenomenon. Different causes have been attributed, including local mechanical sources, often from industrial plants, as well as manifestations of tinnitus or other biological auditory effects.

Misophonia (or selective sound sensitivity syndrome) is a disorder of decreased tolerance

to specific sounds or their associated stimuli, or cues. In Schlee W, Langguth B, De Ridder D, Vanneste S (eds. These cues, known as "triggers", are experienced as unpleasant or distressing and tend to evoke strong negative emotional, physiological, and behavioral responses not seen in most other people. Misophonia and the behaviors that people with misophonia often use to cope with it (such as avoidance of "triggering" situations or using hearing protection) can adversely affect the ability to achieve life goals, communicate effectively, and enjoy social situations. In 2022, an international panel of misophonia experts published a consensus definition of misophonia, and since then, clinicians and researchers studying the condition have widely adopted that definition.).

There are a variety of causes and risk factors, with the most common being exposure to loud noise. It is often coincident with tinnitus. Proposed mechanisms in the literature involve dysfunction in the brain, inner ear, or middle ear. afccdd1dbc

Hyperacusis Definitions of hyperacusis can vary significantly; it often revolves around damage to or dysfunction of the stapes bone, stapedius muscle or tensor tympani. Tinnitus may be associated with hearing loss or decreased comprehension of speech in noisy environments. It is common, affecting about 10–15% of people. Most tolerate it well, and

it is a significant (severe) problem
in only 1–2% of people.

beam than any normal
loudspeaker system using audio
frequencies. Most of the work was
performed in liquids (for
underwater sound use).

disease, tinnitus is a symptom
that may result from a variety of
underlying causes and may be
generated at any level of the
auditory system as well as
outside that system. The most
common causes are hearing
damage, noise-induced hearing
loss, or age-related hearing loss,
known as presbycusis. Other
causes include ear infections,
disease of the heart or blood
vessels, Ménière's disease, brain
tumors, acoustic neuromas
(tumors on the auditory nerves of
the ear), migraines,
temporomandibular joint
disorders, exposure to certain
medications, a previous head
injury, and earwax. In some
people, it interferes with
concentration, and can be
associated with anxiety and
depression. It can suddenly

The terms auditory hypersensitivity or hypersensitivity to sounds are often used. However, the term "sensitivity" can also be used to describe low-level sensory perceptual functioning, especially the ability to detect or discriminate between sensory stimuli, such as that which might be affected in hearing loss. This is distinct from the heightened responses, mostly of distress and discomfort, that underpin the sort of auditory hypersensitivity discussed in this article; individuals with auditory hypersensitivity generally have an average ability to detect or discriminate sounds. afccdd1dbc

A 1973 report cites a university study of fifty cases of people complaining about a "low throbbing background noise" that others

were unable to hear. The sound, always peaking between 30 and 40 Hz (hertz), was found to only be heard during cool weather with a light breeze, and often early in the morning. These noises were often confined to a 10-kilometre (6 mi) wide area. For some who are capable of hearing it, The Hum can be a disturbing phenomenon, which has been linked to at least three suicides in the United Kingdom... afccdd1dbc
