== Etymology == baa4f7dce3 Signs and symptoms of early pregnancy may include missed periods, tender breasts, morning sickness (nausea and vomiting), hunger, implantation bleeding, and frequent urination. Pregnancy may be confirmed with a pregnancy test. Methods of contraception are used to avoid pregnancy. baa4f7dce3 In human prenatal development, fetal development begins from the ninth week after fertilization (which is the eleventh week of gestational age) and continues until the birth of a newborn. baa4f7dce3

Pregnancy A multiple pregnancy involves more than one offspring, such as with twins. at 4 weeks after fertilization (gestational age of 6 weeks) Fetus at 8 weeks after fertilization (gestational age of 10 weeks) Fetus at 18 weeks after Pregnancy is the time during which one or more offspring gestates inside a woman's uterus baa4f7dce3

Pregnant women's rights Specifically those under medical care within a medical establishment or those under the care of a medical professional regardless of location (under care of paramedics at home, family doctor via phone, etc. from Harmful Work: Pregnant women must be protected from tasks that could be harmful to their health and the health of the fetus. The word fetus (plural fetuses or rarely, the solecism feti) comes from Latin fētus 'offspring, bringing forth, hatching of young'. The Latin plural fetūs is not used in English; occasionally the plural feti is used in English by analogy with second-declension Latin nouns. baa4f7dce3

Human infections may be treated with erythromycin as antimicrobial resistance. A pregnancy may end in a live birth, a miscarriage, an induced abortion, or a stillbirth. Childbirth typically occurs around 40 weeks from the start of the last menstrual period (LMP), a span known as the gestational age; this is just over nine months. Counting by fertilization age, the length is about 38 weeks. Implantation occurs

on average 8–9 days after fertilization. An embryo is the term for the developing offspring during the first seven weeks following implantation (i.e. ten weeks' gestational age), after which the term fetus is used until the birth of a baby. baa4f7dce3 Pregnancy is divided into three trimesters of approximately... baa4f7dce3

The fetus is considered full-term between weeks 37 and 40.
