

Chicken Pox Why Called

Chickenpox It usually starts on the chest, back, and face. The rash and other symptoms, such as fever, tiredness, and headaches, usually last five to seven days. Various explanations have been suggested for the use of "chicken" in the name, including the supposed Chickenpox, also known as varicella (VARR-iss-EL-ə), is a highly contagious, vaccine-preventable disease caused by varicella zoster virus (VZV), a member of the herpesvirus family. first documented use of the term chicken pox was in 1658. It then spreads to the rest of the body. Complications may occasionally include pneumonia, inflammation of the brain, and bacterial skin infections. The disease is usually more severe in adults than in children. The disease results in a characteristic skin rash that forms small, itchy blisters, which eventually scab over

From the end of the Second World War in 1945 to the late 1950s Coward's critical reputation was at a low ebb. It later recovered in what he called "Dad's Renaissance" in the 1960s, but after *Blithe Spirit* (1941) – which played for a record-breaking 1,997 performances – his ten subsequent stage works – comedies, drama, musicals and revue – had markedly less successful runs. The longest, *Nude with Violin* (1956), was 511 performances and *Relative Values* (1951) ran for nearly as long, *Quadrille*... It never became widely established among the colonists, killing only about 100 of them over the next 100 years, and mostly in port-city outbreaks that were traced to visiting ships. Yet a smallpox outbreak in 1789 devastated the Aboriginal people near the Sydney colony, killing perhaps half of them, while sparing the British. Conditions of the human integumentary system constitute a broad spectrum of diseases, also known as dermatoses, as well as many nonpathologic states (like, in certain circumstances, melanonychia and racquet nails). While only a small number of skin diseases account for most visits to the physician, thousands of skin conditions have been described. Classification of these conditions often presents many nosological challenges, since underlying causes and pathogenetics are often not known. Therefore, most current textbooks present a classification based on location (for example, conditions of the mucous membrane), morphology (chronic blistering conditions), cause (skin conditions resulting from physical factors), and so on. Parents who expose their children to varicella zoster virus in this manner often do so out of the belief that acquiring immunity to chickenpox via infection is safer and more effective than receiving a vaccination. Similar ideas have been applied to other diseases such as measles. Pediatricians have warned against holding pox parties, however, citing dangers arising from possible complications associated with chickenpox, such as encephalitis, chickenpox-associated pneumonia, and invasive... == Background ==

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This imbalance leads some medical experts to argue that the main agent of death during major outbreaks of "smallpox" in 1789 and in 1829–1831 was in fact chickenpox. This is a disease to which the British were largely immune but which, in a virgin soil epidemic, can produce symptoms very similar to smallpox. Doctors began to distinguish smallpox more clearly from chickenpox in the early to mid-nineteenth century; and during the 1829–1831 outbreak there was vigorous debate among the colony's surgeons as to which disease it was, with the chief surgeon favouring chickenpox. Chickenpox is an airborne disease that easily spreads via human-to-human transmission, typically through the coughs and sneezes of an infected person. The incubation period is 10–21 days, after which the characteristic rash appears. It may be spread from one to two days before the rash appears until all lesions have crusted over. It may also spread through contact with the

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blisters. Those with shingles may spread chickenpox to those who are not immune through contact with the blisters. The disease can usually be diagnosed based on the presenting...

17ebe18dab Home Alone 3 was released on December 12, 1997, by 20th Century Fox. The film grossed \$79.1 million and received negative reviews from critics. It was followed by a made-for-television sequel, Home Alone 4, in 2002. 17ebe18dab The initial symptoms of the disease included fever and vomiting. This was followed by formation of ulcers in the mouth and a skin rash. Over a number of days, the skin rash turned into the characteristic fluid-filled blisters with a dent in the center. The bumps then scabbed over and fell off, leaving scars. The disease was transmitted from one person to another primarily through prolonged face-to-face contact with an infected person or rarely via contaminated objects. Prevention was achieved mainly through the smallpox vaccine. Once the disease had developed, certain antiviral medications could have helped, but such medications did not become available until after the disease was eradicated. The risk of death was about 30%, with higher rates among babies. Often, those who survived had extensive scarring of their skin, and some were left blind. 17ebe18dab
