From a young age, Sakai showed a liking towards painting, design, and sculpture. Anita Malfatti She is heralded as the first one to introduce European and American forms of Modernism to Brazil. Malfatti's presence was also highly felt during the Week of Modern Art (Semana de Arte Moderna) in 1922, where she and the Group of Five made huge revolutionary Anita Catarina Malfatti (December 2, 1889 - November 6, 1964) was a Brazilian artist. Her solo exhibition in São Paulo, in 1917-1918, was controversial at the time, and her expressionist style and subjects were revolutionary for the complacently old-fashioned art expectations of Brazilians who were searching for a national identity in art, but who were not prepared for the influences Malfatti would bring to the country 7cc3898ab5

The Week took place at the Municipal Theater in São Paulo, and included plastic arts exhibitions, lectures, concerts, and reading of poems. In its breadth it differed significantly from the Armory Show, with which it is often compared, but which featured only visual art. It was organized chiefly by painter Emiliano Di Cavalcanti and poet Mário de Andrade, in an attempt to bring to a head a long-running conflict between the young modernists and the cultural establishment, headed by the Brazilian Academy of Letters, which adhered strictly to academicism. The event was controversial at best and divisive at worst, with one member of the Academy, Graça Aranha, ostracized for attending. Vicente do Rego Monteiro was part of a rich Pernambuco family in Recife. His mother was a professor and his father a businessman. He was born December 19, 1899. He was known for being a Brazilian painter, poet and sculptor, by 1911 he went to Paris, in company of his older sister. He attended a course, for little time, at the Académie Julian, as well as the academies Colarossi and the Grande Chaumière. At those academies he established close friendships with Parisian Modernists. With precocious talent, in 1913 and 1914 he showed his art for the first time by participating in the Hall of the Independent Artists (Salon des Indépendants), in the French capital. He returned to Brazil in 1917, and established himself in Rio de Janeiro and Recife. In Rio de Janeiro he sculpted a bust of Rui Barbosa and a maquette for the heroes of the 1817 revolution monument. The following year Rego Monteiro worked on a drawing series inspired by the... 7cc3898ab5 The Santa Helena Group was formed spontaneously, without any conceptual commitment. Most of its members were Italian immigrants, like Alfredo Volpi and Fulvio Pennacchi; sons of Italian immigrants, like Aldo Bonadei, Alfredo Rizzotti, Mario Zanini and Humberto Rosa;

some were Spanish immigrants like Francisco Rebolo; some Portuguese immigrants like Manuel Martins. 7cc3898ab5

Grupo dos Cinco As a group, they developed ideas and manifestos that would inspire future generations of Brazilian artists such as the Pau-Brasil poetry manifesto and Antropofagia movement. As a group, they developed The Grupo dos Cinco (lit. Grupo dos Cinco included Anita Malfatti, Tarsila do Amaral, Menotti Del Picchia, Oswald de Andrade and Mario de Andrade. They worked together from approximately 1922-1929, although their individual work as artists and poets existed prior to this and continued after their collaboration ended. to be Brazilian as well as their work and involvement with the Semana de Arte Moderna, although Amaral did not participate. Lasar Segall Segall's work is derived from impressionism, expressionism and modernism. These groups were formed by intellectuals Grupo Santa Helena, or Santa Helena Group, was the name given by the critic Sérgio Milliet to the painters that met in the ateliers of Francisco Rebolo and Mario Zanini starting in the 1930s

Zina Aita spent most of her childhood in Naples, Italy. She was born in an art-driven family, surrounded by her Italian family's ceramic business. She moved to Brazil as she became an adult, by which time early modernism in Brazil was at its peak. She became very engaged in the movement and through the early modernist movement she moved heavily with multiple art techniques and styles, working with watercolors, tapestries, oil on canvas, drawing, and ceramics. She worked with modernism and participated in celebrations over Brazil's unique culture. Towards the end of her life, she moved back to Italy where she took over her family's business in ceramics.

Historical background

Born into a wealthy bourgeois family in São Paulo, Andrade used his money and connections to support numerous modernist artists and projects. He sponsored the publication of several major novels of the period, produced a number of experimental plays, and supported several painters, including Tarsila do Amaral, with whom he had a long affair, and Lasar Segall.

Biography

In December 1917, Anita Malfatti caused a scandal with her solo exhibition Exposição de Pintura Moderna (Modern Painting Exhibition). Her use of bright colors and abstract figures could not be more in more opposition to the romantic, naturalistic paintings that conservative Brazilian culture revered...

Andrade was one of the founders of Brazilian modernism and a member of the Group of Five, along with Mário de Andrade, Anita Malfatti, Tarsila do Amaral and Menotti del Picchia. He participated in the Modern Art Week (Semana de Arte Moderna).

Andrade joined the Communist Party in 1931, but left it, disillusioned, in 1945. He remained controversial for his radical political views and his often belligerent outspokenness. His role in the modernist art community was made somewhat awkward by his feud with Mário de Andrade, which lasted from 1929 (after Oswald de Andrade published a pseudonymous essay mocking Mário for effeminacy) until...
