It can be divided into three natural zones: a mountainous region in the north, with its two highest points at Mount Pelée (an active volcano, 4,428 ft) and the Pitons du Carbet (3,960 ft); the Lamentin Plain in the center; and a hilly region in the south, composed of eroded remnants of old volcanoes and dominated by the Montagne du Vauclin (1,656 ft) and the Morne du Diamant (1,567 ft). 4c0bd3de69 As an overseas department of the French Republic, Martinique is not a member of FIFA and is therefore not eligible to enter the FIFA World Cup or any competition organised first-hand by the organisation. Martiniquais, being French citizens, are eligible to play for the France national football team. Martinique is, however, a member of CONCACAF and CFU and is eligible for all competitions organised by either organisation. Flag of Martinique The flag of Martinique consists of a red triangle at the hoist, with two horizontal bands, the upper green and the lower black. The assembly of Martinique flies a flag with the collectivity's logo on it to represent the government. The flag, known as the rouge-vert-noir ("red-green-black"), uses the pan-African colours. In September 2023, the volcanoes and forests of Mount Pelée and the peaks of northern Martinique, in particular the Pitons du Carbet, were listed as UNESCO World Heritage Sites. 4c0bd3de69 Prior to 2023, Martinique did not have its own official flag. In 2018, the local council held a competition to create a flag and anthem for the island, but two

and a half years following the presentation of the winners, the flag and anthem were annulled by the local administrative tribunal, as the method of their selection was not deemed within the responsibilities of the council. In 2022, the island began a public vote on an official flag and anthem, which shared the same ties to the motherland of Africa. Before the total destruction of Saint-Pierre by a volcanic eruption in 1902, it was the most important city of Martinique culturally and economically, being known as "the Paris of the Caribbean". In 295 A.D, an eruption of Mount Pelée resulted in the decimation of the island's population. Around 400 A.D, the Arawaks returned and repopulated the island. Around 600 A.D, the Caribs arrived. They exterminated the Arawaks and proceeded to settle on the island over the next few centuries. 4c0bd3de69 Saint-Pierre was founded in 1635 by Pierre Belain d'Esnambuc, a French trader and adventurer, as part of the early colonial establishment of Martinique by the Compagnie des Îles de l'Amérique. It quickly developed into an important settlement and port due to its sheltered bay and strategic position within Caribbean trade routes. 4c0bd3de69
