A cabbage generally weighs between 500 and 1,000 grams (1 and 2 lb). Smooth-leafed, firm-headed green cabbages are the most common, with smooth-leafed purple cabbages and crinkle-leafed savoy cabbages of both colours being rarer. Under conditions of long sunny days, such as those found at high northern latitudes in summer, cabbages can grow quite large. As of 2012, the heaviest cabbage was 62.71 kilograms (138 lb 4 oz). Cabbage heads are generally picked during the first year of the plant's life cycle, but plants intended for seed are allowed to grow a second year and must be kept separate from other cole crops to prevent cross-pollination. Cabbage is prone to several nutrient deficiencies, as well as to multiple pests, and bacterial and fungal... 3158b6f1e6

Arabidopsis thaliana The fruit is a silique 5–20 mm long, containing 20–30 seeds *Arabidopsis thaliana*, the thale cress, mouse-ear cress or *arabidopsis*, is a small plant from the mustard family (Brassicaceae), native to Eurasia and Africa. Commonly found along the shoulders of roads and in disturbed land, it is generally considered a weed. are 3 mm in diameter, arranged in a corymb; their structure is that of the typical Brassicaceae 3158b6f1e6

Cabbage fruit is a silique that opens at maturity through dehiscence to reveal brown or black seeds that are small and round in shape. *sabauda*). It is descended from the wild cabbage (*B. oleracea*), and belongs to the "cole crops" or brassicas, meaning it is closely related to broccoli and cauliflower (var. *botrytis*); Brussels sprouts (var. *gemmifera*); and Savoy cabbage (var. Self-pollination is impossible Cabbage, comprising several cultivars of *Brassica oleracea*, is a leafy green, red (purple), or white (pale green) biennial plant grown as an annual vegetable crop for its dense-leaved heads. *oleracea* var 3158b6f1e6

In the first year of growth, plants form clumps of round, slightly wrinkled leaves, that when crushed smell like garlic. The plants flower in spring of the next year, producing cross-shaped white flowers in dense clusters. As the flowering stems bloom they elongate into a spike-like shape. When flowering is complete, plants produce upright fruits that release seeds in mid-summer. Plants are often found growing along the margins of hedges, giving rise to the old British folk name of jack-by-the-hedge. Other common names include garlic root, hedge garlic, sauce-alone, jack-in-the-bush, penny hedge and poor man's mustard. It is an endangered, fire-dependent annual herb occurring in xeric, shrub-dominated habitats on the Lake Wales Ridge of central Florida in the United States. *Warea carteri*'s fruit is a silique, long, slender pod divided lengthwise by a partition (septum). The pod is flattened, cylindrical in cross-section *Warea carteri* is a species of plant in the mustard family, Brassicaceae, known by the common names Carter's pinelandcress and Carter's mustard 3158b6f1e6

Pinguicula 126 species are currently accepted. They use sticky, glandular leaves to lure, trap, and digest insects in order to supplement the poor mineral nutrition they obtain from the environment. The largest number of species is in South and Central America. 13 are native to Europe, 9 to North America, and some to northern Asia. moisture is present the silique closes, protecting the seed and opening again upon dryness to allow for wind dispersal. Many species have a net-like pattern *Pinguicula*, commonly known as butterworts, is a genus of carnivorous flowering plants in the family Lentibulariaceae 3158b6f1e6

== Etymology == 3158b6f1e6 The name *Pinguicula* is derived from a term coined by Conrad Gesner, who in his 1561 work entitled *Horti Germaniae* commented on the glistening leaves: "propter pinguiam et tenera folia..." (Latin *pinguis*, "fat"). The common name "butterwort" reflects this characteristic. 3158b6f1e6 The most widely cultivated species is *Moringa oleifera*, native to the foothills of the Himalayas in northwestern India, a multipurpose tree cultivated throughout the tropics and marketed as a dietary supplement, health food or source for herbalism practices. The fruit pods of *Moringa oleifera* ("drumsticks") are consumed as food in many parts of the world, particularly in South Asia. The leaves are commonly used to make tea. Oils are made from the seeds, while powders can be made from the leaves and roots. 3158b6f1e6

== Description == 3158b6f1e6 Some sources spell the epithet with a single "l" as "gambelii," others with a double

"II" as "gambellii." Watson, in the original 1876 publication, spelled it with a double "I" and stated that it was named after "Gambell," collector of the type specimen. The collector was in fact William Gambel. Section 60.7 of the ICN states that such errors in the spelling of personal names is to be corrected only in the case of the omission of the final letter of the person's name. This is not what happened here. Watson added an extra letter rather than deleting a letter. Hence Watson's error must stand uncorrected in the scientific epithet, though no such rules apply to the common name. 3158b6f1e6

Warea carteri is an annual herb, 0.2 to 1.5 m tall with erect green stems. The plants usually have many slender, ascending branches forming an open, rounded crown. The leaves lack stipules and are arranged alternately on the stem. Lower leaves are lost by the time the plant flowers. Leaf size and shape varies with age and position on the plant. At the time of flowering, leaf petioles range from 0.8 to 3.9 mm with blades 1 to 3 cm long. Towards the tips of stems, the leaves are smaller and narrowly elliptical to almost linear, while closer to the bases of stems and branches, the leaves are larger and oblanceolate or spatulate. All leaves are rounded at the tip, their margins entire, and their bases attenuate to cuneate. The lower leaves can also be undulate, margined or lobed. The many inflorescences of W. carteri are dense, rounded racemes with many flowers (60 or more... 3158b6f1e6 Depending on how broadly the term is defined, the roots and practice of terrorism can be traced at least to the 1st-century AD Sicarii Zealots, though some dispute whether the group, which assassinated collaborators with Roman rule in the province of Judea, were in fact terrorists. The first use in English of the term 'terrorism' occurred during the French Revolution's Reign of Terror, when the Jacobins, who ruled the revolutionary state, employed violence, including mass executions by guillotine, to compel obedience to the state and intimidate state enemies. The association of the term only with state violence and intimidation lasted until the mid-19th century, when it began to be associated with non-governmental groups. Anarchism, often in league with rising nationalism and anti-monarchism, was the most prominent ideology... 3158b6f1e6 Tower mustard typically reaches 40 to 120 centimeters in height at full growth, but may be stunted to just 30 centimeters or might reach 1.5 meters in height in exceptional circumstances. It is typically a biennial herb, but may occasionally be a short lived perennial. Plants have a tap-root and fibrous side-roots. Plants usually have several erect, usually unbranched stems which are grey in the lower parts with a covering of simple hairs, but green and glabrous (hairless) above. 3158b6f1e6 Moringa is considered one of the most widely diverse genera for its size ranging from small shrubs (M. pygmaea) to large pachycaul trees (M. ovalifolia). 3158b6f1e6

A winter annual with a relatively short lifecycle, A. thaliana is a popular model organism in plant biology and genetics. For a complex multicellular eukaryote, A. thaliana has a relatively small genome of around 135 megabase pairs. Turritis glabra 7 cm wide, flattened, and held vertically beside Turritis glabra, commonly known as tower rockcress or tower mustard, is a tall, slim, grey-green plant with small creamy flowers at the top of the stem. 7 cm long; 6 stamens and 1 style. It usually grows on poor chalky or sandy soils, in open situations. The fruit is a greenish silique up to 8 cm long by 1. yellow petals up to 1. It can be found in many other parts of the world as an introduced species. It is native to Europe, Asia, and North Africa, and it is widespread in North America where it is also probably native 3158b6f1e6

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
