Over time, scar tissue and nodules of regenerating hepatocytes can replace the parenchyma, causing increased resistance to blood flow in the liver's capillaries—the hepatic sinusoids—and consequently portal hypertension, as well as impairment in other aspects of liver function 085ea555aa

The acute syndrome presents with rapidly progressive and severe upper abdominal pain, yellow discoloration of the skin and whites of the eyes, liver enlargement, spleen enlargement, fluid accumulation within the peritoneal cavity, elevated liver enzymes, and eventually encephalopathy. Congestive hepatopathy When severe and longstanding, hepatic congestion can lead to fibrosis; if congestion is due to right heart failure, it is called cardiac cirrhosis. congested hepatic venules and small hepatic veins. The gross pathological appearance of a liver affected by chronic passive congestion is "speckled" like a grated nutmeg kernel; the dark spots represent the dilated and congested hepatic venules and small hepatic veins. Liver hemangiomas are usually asymptomatic but can present with symptoms such as right upper quadrant pain and abdominal fullness. Treatment options, if necessary, include various surgical methods, such as

enucleation or resection. Patients with hypercoagulable disorders, polycythemia vera, and hepatocellular carcinoma are at a higher risk of having Budd-Chiari syndrome. == Signs and symptoms == The disease typically develops slowly over months or years. Stages include compensated cirrhosis and decompensated cirrhosis. Early symptoms may include tiredness, weakness, loss of appetite, unexplained weight loss, nausea and vomiting, and discomfort in the right upper quadrant of the abdomen. As the disease worsens, symptoms may include itchiness, swelling in the lower legs, fluid build-up in the abdomen, jaundice, bruising easily, and the development of spider-like blood vessels in the skin... == Acute == Liver diseases == Signs and symptoms depend largely upon the primary lesions giving rise to the condition. In addition to the heart or lung symptoms, there will be a sense of fullness and tenderness in the right hypochondriac region. Gastrointestinal catarrh is usually present, and vomiting of blood may occur. There is usually more or less jaundice. Owing to portal obstruction, ascites occurs, followed later by generalised oedema. The stools are light or clay-colored, and the urine is colored by bile. On palpation, the liver is found enlarged and tender, sometimes extending several inches below the costal margin of the ribs.

Cavernous liver hemangioma It is the most common benign liver tumour, and is usually asymptomatic and diagnosed incidentally on radiological imaging or during laparotomy for other intra-abdominal issues. Liver hemangiomas are thought to be congenital in origin with an incidence rate of 0.4 – 7%. This typically involves supportive care and addressing the triggers of the event. Lactulose is frequently used to decrease ammonia levels. Certain antibiotics (such as rifaximin) and probiotics are other potential options. A liver transplant may improve outcomes in those with severe disease. 085ea555aa It is usually seen in younger adults, with the median age at diagnosis between 35 and 40 years, and it has a similar incidence in males and females. It is a very rare condition, affecting one in a million adults. The syndrome can be fulminant, acute, chronic, or asymptomatic. Subacute presentation is the most common form. 085ea555aa Several subtypes exist, including the giant hepatic haemangioma (>10cm), which can cause significant complications. 085ea555aa == Signs and symptoms == 085ea555aa The condition is diagnosed based on the existence of liver cirrhosis and fluid build-up in the abdomen (ascites) and analysis of the fluid. The fluid has a low protein content. Mainly, the condition is treated by medical management, such as diet adjustment and usage of diuretics. When the condition does not respond, it is known as refractory hepatic hydrothorax: treatment includes inserting a transjugular intrahepatic portosystemic shunt (TIPS). The only curative treatment is a liver transplant. The prognosis is usually unfavorable... 085ea555aa == Signs and symptoms == 085ea555aa Apart from chemotherapy, hepatic veno-occlusive disease may also occur after ingestion of certain plant alkaloids such as pyrrolizidine alkaloids (in some herbal teas), and has been described as part of a rare hereditary disease called hepatic venoocclusive disease with immunodeficiency (which results from mutations in the gene coding for a protein called SP110). 085ea555aa Features of hepatic veno-occlusive disease include weight gain, tender enlargement of the liver, ascites, and yellow discoloration of the skin; it often is associated with acute kidney... 085ea555aa

The symptoms are non-specific and vary widely, but it may present with the classical triad of abdominal pain, ascites, and liver enlargement. Untreated Budd-Chiari syndrome can result in liver failure.

Hepatic encephalopathy can occur in those with acute or chronic liver disease. Episodes can be triggered by alcoholism, infections, gastrointestinal bleeding, constipation, electrolyte problems, or certain medications. The underlying mechanism is believed to involve the buildup of ammonia in the blood, a substance that is normally removed by the liver. The diagnosis is typically based on symptoms after ruling out other potential causes. It may be supported by blood ammonia levels, an electroencephalogram, or computer tomography (CT scan) of the brain.

Liver failure Recently, a third form of liver failure known as acute-on-chronic liver failure (ACLF) is increasingly being recognized. on the time from onset of first hepatic symptoms to onset of encephalopathy. Two forms are recognised, acute and chronic (cirrhosis). One scheme defines "acute hepatic failure" as the development of encephalopathy Liver failure is the inability of the liver to perform its normal synthetic and metabolic functions as part of normal physiology

Hepatic hydrothorax Over 85% of cases occurring on the right, 13% on the left, and 2% on both. Hepatic hydrothorax is a rare form of pleural effusion that occurs in people with liver cirrhosis. It is found in 5–10% of people with liver cirrhosis and 2–3% of people with pleural effusions. Although it is most common in people with severe ascites, it can also occur in people with mild or no ascites. In cases of

decompensated liver cirrhosis, prevalence rises significantly up to 90%. It is defined as an effusion of over 500 mL in people with liver cirrhosis that is not caused by heart, lung, or pleural disease. It is defined as an effusion of over 500 mL in people Hepatic hydrothorax is a rare form of pleural effusion that occurs in people with liver cirrhosis. Symptoms are not specific and mostly involve the respiratory system 085ea555aa

Hepatic veno-occlusive disease It is classically marked by weight gain due to fluid retention, increased liver size, and raised levels of bilirubin in the blood. It is a complication of high-dose chemotherapy given before a bone marrow transplant or excessive exposure to hepatotoxic pyrrolizidine alkaloids. The name sinusoidal obstruction syndrome (SOS) is preferred if hepatic veno-occlusive disease happens as a result of chemotherapy or bone marrow transplantation. In the bone marrow transplant setting, hepatic veno-occlusive disease is felt to be due to injury to the hepatic venous endothelium Hepatic veno-occlusive disease (VOD) or veno-occlusive disease with immunodeficiency is a potentially life-threatening condition in which some of the small veins in the liver are obstructed. acute kidney failure 085ea555aa

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
