Neutrons are also produced in the spontaneous and induced fission of certain heavy nuclides. For some medical conditions, one or more causes are somewhat understood, but in a certain percentage of instances, the cause may not be readily apparent or characterized. In these cases, the origin of the condition is said to be idiopathic. With some other medical conditions, the root cause for a large percentage of all cases has not been established—for example, focal segmental glomerulosclerosis or ankylosing spondylitis; the majority of these cases are deemed idiopathic. Certain medical conditions, when idiopathic, notably some forms of epilepsy and stroke, are preferentially described by the synonymous term of cryptogenic. CAP is a marker of

sleep instability and it is found during non-rapid eye movement sleep (NREM). CAP is organized into sequences of successive cycles composed of two phases, A and B. Phase A involves phasic events, in other words, not continuous. Phase A subtypes of CAP allow adaptive adjustments of ongoing states to internal and external inputs. Neutron emission atom does not become an atom of a different element, but a different isotope of the same element. Spontaneous generation Spontaneous generation was taken as scientific fact for two millennia. It was hypothesized that certain forms, such as fleas, could arise from inanimate matter such as dust, or that maggots could arise from dead flesh. Though challenged in the 17th and 18th centuries by the experiments of the Italian biologists Francesco Redi and Lazzaro Spallanzani, it was not discredited until the work of the French chemist Louis Pasteur and the Irish physicist John Tyndall in the mid-19th

century. The doctrine of spontaneous generation was coherently synthesized by the Greek philosopher and naturalist Aristotle, who compiled and expanded the work of earlier natural philosophers and the various ancient explanations for the appearance of organisms. person in response to a startling or shocking event or condition. He's shooting at us. It is an exception to the hearsay rule. " or "I think he's crazy. Compared to present sense impression, excited utterance is broader in scope for permitting a longer time lapse between event and statement, and a wider range of content in the statement. The subject matter and content of the statement must "relate to" the event or condition in question. " The basis for this hearsay exception is the belief that a statement made under the stress is likely to be trustworthy and unlikely to be a premeditated falsehood. We're going to crash. Spontaneity of the declarant is a key to admissibility. refers to the affirmative assertion of the statement. It is an unplanned reaction to a "startling event". The statement could be a description or explanation (as required for present sense impression), or an opinion or inference. The statement must be spontaneously made by the person (the declarant) while still under the stress of excitement from the event or condition. Examples include: "Look out 7b9c4d5ac7
