Cavernous hemangioma The blood vessels do not form the necessary junctions with surrounding cells, and the structural support from the smooth muscle is hindered, causing leakage into the surrounding tissue. Despite its designation as a hemangioma, a cavernous hemangioma is a benign (but not harmless) condition, not a malignant tumor, as it does not display endothelial hyperplasia. Hepatitis Chronic hepatitis may progress to scarring of the liver (cirrhosis), liver failure, and liver cancer. Acute hepatitis can resolve on its own, progress to chronic hepatitis, or (rarely) result in acute liver failure. Hepatitis is acute if it resolves within six months, and chronic if it lasts longer than six months. Hepatitis is inflammation of the liver tissue.
