A half-life often describes the decay of discrete entities, such as radioactive atoms. For example, the medical sciences refer to the biological half-life of drugs and other chemicals in the human body. The term is commonly used in nuclear physics to describe how quickly unstable atoms undergo radioactive decay or how long stable atoms survive. The converse of half-life is doubling time, an exponential property which increases by a factor of 2 rather than reducing by that factor. The term is also used more generally to characterize any type of exponential (or, rarely, non-exponential) decay
