Semantics Semantics is the study of linguistic meaning. It examines what meaning is, how words get their meaning, and how the meaning of a complex expression depends on its parts. Part of this process involves the distinction between sense and reference. Semantics, together with syntactics and pragmatics, is a part of semiotics. Philosophical inquiry usually centers on linguistic meaning, studying how words, sentences, and utterances acquire content and convey information. It examines how expressions describe the world and evoke emotions while distinguishing between speaker meaning and conventional meaning, and between literal and figurative meaning. Central debates address the contrast between sense and reference; the roles of vagueness, ambiguity, and context-dependence; and how the meaning of a complex expression depends on the meanings of its parts. Philosophers also discuss non-linguistic meaning associated with gestures, pictures, actions, and natural signs, such as footprints. Another topic concerns the meaning of life, asking whether human life or existence as a whole has a higher purpose. 68ec62cec3 When applied to human data, GWA studies compare the DNA of participants having varying phenotypes for a particular trait or disease.
