... This condition is idiopathic, meaning there is no known cause. Risk factors include being overweight or a recent increase in weight. Tetracycline may also trigger the condition. The diagnosis is based on symptoms and a high opening pressure found during a lumbar puncture with no specific cause found on a brain scan. About 2 per 100,000 people are newly affected per year. The condition most commonly affects women aged 20–50. Women are affected about 20 times more often than men. The condition was first described in 1897.

Eye drop Drops containing only saline and sometimes a lubricant are often used as artificial tears to treat dry eyes or simple eye irritation such as itching or redness. Eye drops usually contain saline to match the salinity of the eye. Syringe designed Eye drops or eyedrops are liquid drops applied directly to the surface of the eye usually in small amounts such as a single drop or a few drops. Eye drops may also contain one or more medications to treat a wide

variety of eye diseases. Eye drops have less of a risk of side effects than do oral medicines, and such risk can be minimized by occluding the lacrimal punctum (i.e. pressing on the inner corner of the eye) for a short while after instilling drops. 63244e3d4d == Signs and symptoms == 63244e3d4d The eye can be considered as a living optical device. It is approximately spherical in shape, with its outer layers, such as the outermost, white part of the eye (the sclera) and one of its inner layers (the pigmented choroid) keeping the eye essentially light tight except on the eye's optic axis. In order, along the optic axis, the optical components consist of a first lens (the cornea—the clear part of the eye) that accounts for most of the optical power of the eye and accomplishes most of the focusing of light from the outside world; then an aperture (the pupil) in a diaphragm (the iris—the coloured part of the eye), which controls the amount of light entering the interior of the eye; then another lens (the crystalline lens) that accomplishes the remaining focusing of light into images; and finally a light-sensitive part of the eye (the retina), where the images fall and are processed. The retina makes a connection to the brain via the optic nerve. The remaining components of the eye keep it in its required... 63244e3d4d About half of adults have a headache in a given year. Tension headaches are the most common, affecting 24.9% of the population followed by migraine headaches which affect 14.1%. 63244e3d4d Headaches can occur as a result of many conditions. There are a number of

different classification systems for headaches. The most well-recognized is that of the International Headache Society, which classifies it into more than 150 types of primary and secondary headaches. Causes of headaches may include dehydration; fatigue; sleep deprivation; stress; the effects of medications (overuse) and recreational drugs, including withdrawal; viral infections; loud noises; head injury; rapid ingestion of a very cold food or beverage; and dental or sinus issues (such as sinusitis). Prior to the development of single-use pre-loaded sterile plastic applicators, eye drops were administered using an eye dropper, a glass pipette with a rubber bulb. == Signs and symptoms == In addition, affected individuals may experience paralysis of various facial nerves and drooping of the upper eyelid (ptosis). Rowland Payne syndrome It is named after Dr C M E Rowland Payne, a British dermatologist working at St Thomas' Hospital, London, who first described the condition in 1981 in three patients with metastatic breast cancer seen at the Royal Marsden Hospital. The syndrome is listed in Magalini's Dictionary of Medical Syndromes and appears in standard neurology textbooks. Horner's syndrome alone may result from carotid artery dissection, cluster headache, or brainstem stroke. Vocal cord paralysis may follow thyroid surgery or Rowland Payne syndrome (RPS) is a rare neurological syndrome characterised by the simultaneous ipsilateral occurrence of Horner's syndrome, vocal cord paralysis, and hemidiaphragm paralysis, resulting from disruption of the cervical sympathetic chain, the recurrent laryngeal nerve (or its parent vagus nerve), and the phrenic nerve

In 2004, the International Headache Society defined the diagnostic criteria, which included granuloma. The two most common causes of acute pancreatitis are a gallstone blocking the common bile duct after the pancreatic duct has joined; and heavy alcohol use. Farsightedness But, due to this accommodative effort for distant vision, people may complain of eye strain during prolonged reading. Newborns are almost invariably hypermetropic, but it gradually decreases as the newborn gets older. Minor hypermetropia in young patients is usually corrected by their accommodation, without any defects in vision. The common symptom is eye strain Far-sightedness, also known as long-sightedness, hypermetropia, and hyperopia, is a condition of the eye where distant objects are seen clearly but near objects appear blurred. This blur is due to incoming light being focused behind, instead of on, the retina due to insufficient accommodation by the lens. 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Serious side effects include allergic reactions, abnormal heart rhythms, and low or high blood pressure, while less serious side effects include headaches, insomnia, and impotence.
