Use during pregnancy is not recommended. Doxycycline can be used in children of all ages, including for Lyme disease and rickettsial infections. Like other agents of the tetracycline class, it slows or kills bacteria by inhibiting protein production. It kills Plasmodium—microorganisms associated with malaria—by targeting a plastid organelle, the apicoplast. 102fe007aa == Clinical uses == 102fe007aa The disease often goes untreated because of the scarcity of medical treatment in the countries in which it is found. In addition, the painless genital ulcers can be mistaken for syphilis. The ulcers ultimately progress to destruction of internal and external tissue, with extensive leakage of mucus and blood from the highly vascular lesions. In prophylactic therapy, 100 mg (adult dose) of doxycycline should be given Antimalarial medications or simply antimalarials are a type of antiparasitic chemical agent, often naturally derived, that can be used to treat or to prevent malaria, in the latter case, most often aiming at two susceptible target groups, young children and pregnant women 102fe007aa

Oral manifestations are also notably seen. The lesions of oral cavity are usually secondary to active genital lesions. It is also known as donovanosis, granuloma genitoinguinale, granuloma inguinale tropicum, granuloma venereum, granuloma venereum genitoinguinale, lupoid form of groin ulceration, serpiginous ulceration of the groin, ulcerating granuloma of the pudendum, and ulcerating sclerosing granuloma. It is endemic in many less-developed regions 102fe007aa

Several malaria vaccines are under development, and while current vaccines are somewhat effective, more research is needed for sustained malaria control. 102fe007aa

Malaria prophylaxis regimens include: doxycycline 100 mg once daily (started one day before travel, and continued for four weeks after returning); mefloquine 250 mg once weekly Malaria prophylaxis refers to measures used to prevent malaria infection in individuals at risk of exposure to *Plasmodium* parasites transmitted by *Anopheles* mosquitoes. Prophylactic medication is commonly recommended for travelers to endemic regions and for certain populations living in areas with ongoing malaria transmission. The choice of prophylactic strategy depends on factors such as geographic

location, parasite resistance patterns, patient characteristics, and duration of exposure. These measures include mosquito bite avoidance strategies and the use of antimalarial medications taken before, during, and after exposure 102fe007aa

Atovaquone/proguanil synthesis. A standard tablet of Malarone contains 100 mg of proguanil hydrochloride and 250 mg of atovaquone. A pediatric tablet contains 25 mg of proguanil hydrochloride 102fe007aa
