

Vietnam Triangular Root That Grows On Trees

Plants may grow to about 20 metres in height and have a long root system with a deep tap root, that can be as large as a small car. The stems are green, pubescent and quadrangular when young, becoming brown, rounded and woody with age. 922008ddbc *Solena amplexicaulis* is a perennial climbing plant with thick, tuberous roots. The branched stem is hairless and bears slender curling tendrils and alternate leaves with slender stalks up to 1 cm (0.4 in) long. The leaf blades are leathery, ovate to oblong with heart-shaped bases and pointed tips. They are up to 12 cm (5 in) long and 5 cm (2 in) wide, with entire or bluntly-toothed margins and either bristly or smooth upper and lower surfaces. Plants are dioecious, with male and female flowers appearing on separate plants. The flowers are borne in the leaf axils; the male flowers are small and grow in short-stalked umbels of ten to twenty flowers, each with a tubular calyx from which the triangular petal tips protrude. They are creamy yellow. The female flowers are rather larger and usually solitary, with three stigmas and ovoid inferior ovaries. The fruits grow up to 5 cm (2 in) long and turn reddish-brown as they ripen. Genetically *Fokienia* is much closer to *Chamaecyparis*, and not all researchers recognize *Fokienia* as a separate genus. The inner flesh of the mature fruit forms a regular part of the diets of many people in the tropics and subtropics. Coconut endosperm contains a large quantity of a liquid, "coconut water". Mature coconuts can be processed for oil and coconut milk from the flesh, charcoal from the hard shell, and coir from the fibrous husk. Dried coconut flesh is called copra, and the oil and milk derived from it are commonly used in cooking and in soaps and cosmetics. Sweet coconut sap can be made into drinks or fermented into palm wine or coconut vinegar. It is a bush reaching 1.5 meters (4 ft 11 in) in height. Its oblong, hairless leaves are 17.8 by 7 centimeters (7.0 by 2.8 in) with wedge shaped bases, cusped tips and wavy margins. The leaves have 11 pairs of secondary veins emanating from their midribs. Its petioles are 1 centimeters long and covered in fine hairs. Its flowers are born on pedicels that are 2.5 centimeters long. Its 3 red, oval, ribbed, hairy sepals are 0.6 centimeters long. Its flowers have 6 petals arranged in two rows of three. Its red, leathery, oval to lance-shaped, hairy outer petals are 1.5–3.2 by 0.6–1.75 centimeters long. The margins of the outer petals are rolled back. Its triangular, hairy inner petals are 0.9–1.25 centimeters long. Its flower have 10–54 carpels. Its fruit have stipes that are 6.5–16 millimeters long. 922008ddbc

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
