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Lac-Phe Activity dependent Lactoylphenylalanine, or Lac-Phe, is an N-lactoyl-amino acid metabolite produced by mammals and microorganisms. In mice, high levels of Lac-Phe in the blood cause a decrease of food intake and in humans, its production has been shown to correlate with adipose tissue loss during an endurance exercise intervention. In humans, levels are increased by intense exercise and in the inborn error of metabolism phenylketonuria. It is classified as N-acyl-alpha-amino acid and pseudodipeptide. In an intrauterine device (IUD), such as Mirena among others, it is effective for the long-term prevention of pregnancy. A levonorgestrel-releasing implant is also available in some countries.
