== Biography == Her novels differed from other works in that she did not use eroticism, due to the Spanish regime's strict censorship. Her style was direct and her characters were simply presented. These novels have inspired several telenovelas. Massa implemented a design method known as cloned churches, based on a modular system inspired by Lombard Romanesque architecture. This system allowed churches to be adapted to the budget and terrain using five basic elements: bell tower, nave, chancel, side chapels, and apse. According to studies, this methodology reduced costs by 40% and allowed works to be completed within six months.

In the middle of the conflict, Alfonso IX of León was accused by pope Celestine III of allying himself with a Muslim to fight against a Christian kingdom and was excommunicated, causing Portugal to join the war against León. In the end, the Almohads signed a truce with Alfonso VIII of Castile and Alfonso IX, seeing that he was abandoned by his ally and his kingdom now was being invaded, had to ask for peace. Alfonso IX married Alfonso VIII's daughter, Berengaria of Castile, which eventually led to a peace between both kingdoms.

Shortly after being elected bishop in 1212, he marched with Peter II of Aragon on the latter’s crusade against the Almohads in the Battle of Las Navas de Tolosa. Later Palou served as royal councilor and chancellor of the Crown of Catalonia-Aragon.

Pope Alexander II first preached the Reconquista in 1063 as a "Christian emergency." It was also preached in Burgundy, probably with the permission or participation of Hugh of Cluny, where the abbot's brother, Thomas de Chalon, led the army. Certainly zeal for the crusade spread elsewhere in France, for Amatus of Montecassino notes that the "grand chivalry of the French and Burgundians and other peoples" (grant chevalerie de Francoiz et de Borguegnons et d'autre gent) was present at the siege. Her ideas about women's rights in education also made her a prominent feminist figure. In 1219, he participated in the Fifth Crusade against Damietta in Egypt, contributing to the effort 50 knights and peons and unsuccessfully attempted to prevent the Cathar Crusade. == Modular church system == Early life... Marín has taught at major Chilean universities, with a recognized professional career at universities such as the Pontifical Catholic University of Chile (PUC). He was also dean and secretary general of his alma mater, the Pontifical Catholic University of Valparaíso (PUCV), where he was a student of Héctor Herrera Cajas. It was in Pedro's generation that the use of toponymics, as opposed to just patronymics, began in Spain. Pedro was the first member of his family to use the surname "de Lara", a practice continued by his descendants. A good example of Pedro's style is found in a royal charter of 1 February 1124: *uenerabilis comes dominus Petrus de Lara*, "the venerable count Don Pedro de Lara". Professor Marín joined the PUCV History Institute in 1985, where he earned his degree as teacher of History and Geography in the early 1990s. Then he also completed there his Master of Arts on History.
