== History ==

In 2011, the FBI raided A suicide bag, also known as an exit bag or hood, is part of a euthanasia device consisting of a large plastic bag with a drawcord used to die by suicide through inert gas asphyxiation. It is usually used in conjunction with a flow of an inert gas that is lighter or less dense than air, like helium or nitrogen. This method also makes the direct cause of death difficult to trace if the bag and gas canister are removed before the death is investigated

Jumping is the most common method of suicide in Hong Kong, accounting for 52.1% of all reported cases in 2006; such high rates may partially be the result of the city's abundance of high-rise buildings. In the United States, jumping is among the least common methods of suicide (less than 2% of all reported suicides in 2005). However, in a 75-year period to 2012, there had been around 1,400 suicides at the Golden Gate Bridge. In New Zealand, secure fencing at the Grafton Bridge substantially reduced the rate of suicides.

Hanging is divided into suspension hanging and the much rarer drop hanging — the latter can kill in various ways. People who survive either because the cord or its anchor point of attachment breaks, or because they are discovered and cut down, can face a range of serious injuries, including cerebral anoxia (which can lead to permanent brain damage), laryngeal fracture, cervical fracture, tracheal fracture, pharyngeal laceration, and carotid artery injury. Ron M. Brown writes that... Halligan's case has been cited by legislators in various states proposing legislation to curb

cyberbullying. In Vermont, laws were subsequently enacted to address the cyberbullying problem and the risk of teen suicides, in response. In the International Statistical Classification of Diseases and Related Health Problems, suicides by hanging are classified under the code X70: "Intentional self-harm by hanging, strangulation, and suffocation. It is one of the most commonly used suicide methods and has a high mortality rate; Gunnell et al. However, a study of people who

attempted suicide by hanging and lived suggests that many people overestimate its simplicity and ease. people who had made a near-fatal suicide attempt found that those who had attempted a hanging considered it a painless, quick, simple, and clean method Hanging is a common method of suicide in which a person strangles themselves with a rope or other material, which leads to asphyxiation and death. The materials required are easily available, making it a difficult method to prevent. "

While assisted suicide is not legal in all countries, it is legal under certain circumstances in some countries including Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Germany, Jersey, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Portugal (law not yet in force, awaiting regulation), Spain, Switzerland, and parts of the United States. The constitutional courts of Colombia, Estonia and Italy have legalized assisted suicide, but their legislatures have not yet legislated or regulated the practice. Method-specific ways to do this might include restricting access to pesticides, firearms, and commonly used drugs. Other important measures are the introduction of policies that address the misuse of alcohol and the treatment of mental disorders. Gun-control measures in a number of countries have seen a reduction in suicides and other gun-related deaths. Other preventive measures are not method-specific; these include support, access to treatment, and calling a crisis hotline. There are multiple talk therapies that reduce suicidal thoughts and behaviors regardless of method, including dialectical behavior therapy (DBT). Halligan's father, John P. Halligan, a former IBM engineer, subsequently lobbied for laws to be passed in Vermont to improve how schools address bullying and suicide prevention. John has also given speeches at schools in other states about the story of his son.
