Psychoeducation The term has also been used for programs that address physical illnesses, such as cancer. Psychoeducation is most often associated with serious mental illness, including schizophrenia, clinical depression, anxiety disorders, eating disorders, bipolar disorder and personality disorders. self-awareness of the state of their illness (such as identifying early warning signs of episodes in bipolar disorder) and increasing medication adherence

A related condition is **anosmia**, in which no odors can be detected. In 2012 an estimated 9. 4 million had anosmia or severe hyposmia

Hyposmia is relatively common, particularly in older adults, and population studies suggest that a significant portion of individuals over the age of 40 experience some degree of reduced olfactory function.

Experts believe that an estimated 5.5 million Americans have Alzheimer's disease. The number of people with Alzheimer's disease doubles for every 5-year interval beyond age 65. The Centers for Disease Control issued a report in 2017 showing that Alzheimer's-related deaths increased by 54.5% between 1999 and 2014.

Most documented cases have occurred in athletes involved in striking-based combat sports, such as boxing, kickboxing, and mixed martial arts, and contact sports, such as rugby union, rugby league, gridiron football, Australian rules football, professional wrestling, and ice hockey. It is also an issue in association football, but largely as a result of heading the ball rather than player contact. Other risk factors include being in the military (combat arms) or law enforcement, prior domestic violence, and repeated injuries to the head. The exact amount of trauma required for the condition to occur is unknown, and as of 2026 definitive diagnosis can only occur at autopsy, thus, it can only be diagnosed postmortem. The disease is classified as a tauopathy.

The strongest genetic risk factor is from an allele of apolipoprotein E, a protein involved in the metabolism of fats in mammals. Other risk factors include a history of head injury, clinical depression, and high blood pressure. The progression of the disease is largely characterised by the accumulation of malformed protein... 487edbbeca == Overview == 487edbbeca Psychoeducation teaches patients and families problem-solving and communication skills, while providing education and resources in an empathetic, supportive environment. Certain individuals with alcohol-related dementia present with damage to the frontal lobes of their brain causing disinhibition, loss of planning and executive functions, and a disregard for the consequences of their behavior. Other types of alcohol-related dementia such as Wernicke encephalopathy cause the destruction of certain areas of the brain, where changes in memory, primarily a loss of short-term memory, are the main symptom. Kapp played college football for the California Golden Bears, winning the Voit and Pop Warner trophies and earning first-team All-American honors in 1958 en route to an appearance in the 1959 Rose Bowl. He began his professional career with the Calgary Stampeders, where he spent two seasons before joining the Lions. During his six seasons with the Lions, he led the team to their first championship title in the 52nd Grey Cup while receiving the Jeff Nicklin Memorial Trophy and two All-Star selections. Kapp joined the Vikings in 1967, earning Pro Bowl honors two years later en route to a victory in the 1969 NFL Championship and the team's Super Bowl debut in Super Bowl IV.
