form was likely the Tamil kaṭṭāri (காட்டாரி). It is alternatively known in Tamil as kuttuvāḷ (குத்துவால்) which means "stabbing blade". This was adapted into Sanskrit as kaṭār (काटार) or kaṭārī. The name however is of Indo-Aryan origin, which means Tamil loaned the word from them. aa74296571 As a scholarly article from 2022 has demonstrated, referring to the script as "Khojki" is a relatively new phenomenon, coined by the Russian scholar Wladimir Ivanow. This neologism began to replace the original terms used by Ismailis such as Sindhi and (when necessary to distinguish it from other forms of Sindhi script) Khwajah Sindhi. By this, they did not necessarily mean the Sindhi language, but rather the script utilized by their community, known as the Khwajahs or Khojas. To avoid confusion, the British administrative bureaucracy added the term Khwajah, referring to the script as "Khwajah Sindhi" The Ismailis sometimes did the same to distinguish the script from the language, as well as from other scripts used in Sindh. aa74296571

The Khojki script is one of the earliest forms of written Sindhi. The name "Khojki" is likely derived from the Persian word khoja, which means "master", or "lord". In this respect Khojkī or Khojā Sindhī (Sindhi: کھوجکي (Khokji script) خوجکي (Arabic script) कखोजकी (Devanagari)), is a Landa script used formerly and almost exclusively by the Khoja community of parts of South Asia, including Sindh, Gujarat, and Punjab, and by members of Ismaili communities from Myanmar to Africa aa74296571

History of India The pastoral and nomadic Indo-Aryans spread from the Punjab into the Indo-Gangetic Plain. Around 600 BCE a second urbanization. The Vedic Period of the Vedic people in northern India (1500–500 BCE) was marked by the composition of their extensive collections of hymns (Vedas). Early in the second millennium BCE, persistent drought caused the population of the Indus Valley to scatter from large urban centres to villages. Around 1800 - 1500 BCE the Indo-Aryan tribes moved into the north western region of India, modern day Punjab from Central Asia in several waves of migration.
