However, excessively high concentrations can result in oxygen toxicity, leading to lung damage and respiratory failure. Higher oxygen concentrations can also increase the risk of airway fires, particularly while smoking. Oxygen therapy can also dry out the nasal mucosa without humidification. Respiratory therapist Respiratory therapists graduate from a college or university with a degree in respiratory therapy and have passed a national board certifying examination. The National Board for Respiratory Care (NBRC) is responsible for credentialing as a certified respiratory therapist (CRT), or registered respiratory therapist (RRT) in the United States. A respiratory therapist is a specialized healthcare practitioner trained in critical care and cardio-pulmonary medicine in order to work therapeutically A respiratory therapist is a specialized healthcare practitioner trained in critical care and cardio-pulmonary medicine in order to work therapeutically with people who have acute critical conditions, cardiac and pulmonary disease.

Mucus The mucosal barrier is nonetheless selectively permeable, allowing the diffusion of small particles and blocking the entrance of larger particles. A respiratory therapist can recommend airway clearance therapy which uses a number of clearance techniques to help. **Mucus** (, MEW-kəs) is a slippery gel produced by, and covering, mucous membranes. Mucus helps to trap and remove inhaled particles, and prevent the entry of pathogenic fungi, bacteria and viruses at different sites. Mucus is found in the linings of the respiratory, digestive, and urogenital systems, and in the eyes and ears. Mucus forms a protective barrier between epithelial cells on the internal and external surfaces of the body and the outside environment. and impairing mucociliary clearance

This is done through an endotracheal tube or nasotracheal tube. For non-invasive ventilation in people who are conscious, face or nasal masks are used. The two main types of mechanical ventilation include positive pressure ventilation where air is pushed into the lungs through the airways, and negative pressure ventilation where air is pulled into the lungs. Mechanical ventilation is used for many reasons, including to protect the airway due to mechanical or neurologic cause, to ensure adequate oxygenation, or to remove excess carbon dioxide from the lungs. Various healthcare providers are involved with the use of mechanical ventilation and people who require ventilators are typically monitored in an intensive care unit. Mechanical ventilation helps move air into and out of the lungs, with the main goal of helping the delivery of oxygen and removal of carbon dioxide. acute respiratory failure, acute hypoxemia, or prophylactically 23c0d7eb1f

It is a viscous colloidal gel containing water (90–95%), inorganic salts, antimicrobial enzymes (such as lysozymes), antibodies especially immunoglobulin A, and glycoproteins such as lactoferrin and mucins, which are produced by goblet cells in the mucous membranes and submucosal glands. Oxygen therapy Acute indications for therapy include hypoxemia (low blood oxygen levels), carbon monoxide toxicity and cluster headache. It can also be given through bypassing the airway, such as in ECMO therapy. Oxygen can be delivered via nasal cannula, face mask, or endotracheal intubation at normal atmospheric pressure, or in a hyperbaric chamber. Supplemental oxygen can also refer to the use of oxygen enriched air at altitude. It may also be prophylactically given to maintain blood oxygen levels during the induction of anesthesia. extinguish a fire in a medical oxygen delivery tube Oxygen tent - Canopy over a patient to provide supplemental oxygen Respiratory therapist - Practitioner Oxygen therapy, also referred to as supplemental oxygen, is the use of oxygen as medical treatment.
