Pitchers throw a variety of pitches, the easiest and most common pitch being the four-seam fastball. Each type has a slightly different velocity, trajectory, movement, hand position, wrist position and/or arm angle. These variations are intended to confuse the batter and ultimately aid the defensive team in getting the batter or baserunners out. To obtain variety and enhance defensive strategy, the pitcher manipulates the grip on the ball at the point of release.
