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Adverse drug reaction ADRs may occur following a single dose or prolonged administration of a drug or may result from the combination of two or more drugs. The study of ADRs is the concern of the field known as pharmacovigilance.

An adverse event (AE) refers to any unexpected and inappropriate occurrence at the time a drug is used, whether or not the event is associated with the administration of the drug. An ADR is a special type of AE in which a causative relationship can be shown or is suspected. ADRs are only one

type of medication-related harm. Another type of medication-related harm type includes not taking prescribed medications, known as non-adherence. Non-adherence to medications can lead to death and other negative outcomes. Adverse drug reactions require the use of a medication.

Though antimalarial drugs have repeatedly been observed to elicit resistance in the malaria parasite—including for combination therapies featuring artemisinin, where resistance has previously been observed in Southeast Asia, Artemisinin-based combination therapies (ACTs) have remained the foundational treatment for falciparum malaria globally as of 2024. Despite positive outcomes from various modern treatments, serious side effects have been seen to affect some individuals

taking standard doses (e.
