When slavery was abolished in 1888, the tea trade collapsed. In the 1920s, the tea industry was revived by Japanese immigrants, who introduced tea seeds from Sri Lanka and India. Prior to this time, only Chinese tea varieties had been grown in Brazil.

Within these main categories of tea are vast varieties of individual beverages. Some of the variations are due to different strains of the Camellia plant. However, the largest factor in the wide variations comes from differences in tea processing after the tea leaves are harvested. White and green teas are heat-treated (杀青; shā qīng) soon after picking to prevent oxidation. Other differences come from variations in the processing steps. Bubble tea is most commonly made with tapioca pearls (also known as "boba" or "balls"), but it can be made with other toppings as well, such as grass jelly, aloe vera, red bean, and popping boba. It has many varieties and flavors, but the two most popular varieties are pearl black milk tea and pearl green milk tea ("pearl" for the tapioca balls at the bottom).

Chinese tea Green tea is the most common type of tea consumed in China, while black tea is the second most common. It is commonly available in Chinese restaurants and grocery shops worldwide. Pu'er tea Pu-erh tea is made from the leaves of the Yunnan tea plant Camellia sinensis var. It differs from Yunnan tea (dianhong) in that pu'er tea goes through a complex fermentation process.
