Dementia with Lewy bodies Together with Parkinson's disease dementia, DLB is one of the two Lewy body dementias. The disease worsens over time and is usually diagnosed when cognitive impairment interferes with normal daily functioning. be mild or moderate. Unlike some other dementias, memory loss may not be an early symptom. It is a common form of dementia, but the prevalence is not known accurately and many diagnoses are missed. The disease was first described on autopsy by Kenji Kosaka in 1976, and he named the condition several years later. The DSM-IV-TR contains expanded descriptions of disorders. Wordings were clarified and errors were corrected. The categorizations and the diagnostic criteria were largely unchanged. Wolfram syndrome Symptoms can begin to appear as early as childhood to adult years (2-65 years old). patients are more likely to experience fertility impairment and erectile dysfunction, while female patients may encounter menstrual abnormalities. Additionally Wolfram syndrome, also called DIDMOAD (diabetes insipidus, diabetes mellitus, optic atrophy, and deafness), is a rare autosomal-recessive genetic disorder that causes childhood-onset diabetes mellitus, optic atrophy, and deafness as well as various other possible disorders including neurodegeneration. There is a 25% recurrence risk in children 5a3901629b

Paroxysmal nocturnal hemoglobinuria This destructive process occurs due to deficiency of the red blood cell surface protein DAF, which normally inhibits such immune reactions. There is ongoing research into other key features of the disease, such as the high incidence of venous blood clot formation. Research suggests that PNH thrombosis (a blood clot) is caused by both the absence of GPI-anchored complement regulatory proteins (CD55 and CD59) on PNH platelets and the excessive consumption of nitric oxide (NO). pain, difficulty swallowing and pain during swallowing, as well as erectile dysfunction in men; this occurs mainly when the breakdown of red blood cells Paroxysmal nocturnal hemoglobinuria (PNH) is a rare, acquired, life-threatening

disease of the blood characterized by destruction of red blood cells by the complement system, a part of the body's innate immune system. Since the complement cascade attacks the red blood cells within the blood vessels of the circulatory system, the red blood cell destruction (hemolysis) is considered an intravascular hemolytic anemia 5a3901629b

Erectile dysfunction It is the most common sexual problem in males and can cause psychological distress due to its impact on self-image and sexual relationships. The term erectile dysfunction does not encompass other erection-related disorders, such as priapism. Erectile dysfunction (ED), also referred to as impotence, is a form of sexual dysfunction in males characterized by the persistent or recurring inability to achieve or maintain a penile erection with sufficient rigidity and duration for satisfactory sexual activity 5a3901629b

Diabetes Diabetes tends to progress in severity, and is due to either a reduced production of the hormone insulin by the pancreas or unresponsiveness of bodily cells to insulin's effects. Classic symptoms include the three Ps: polydipsia (excessive thirst), polyuria (excessive urination), and polyphagia (excessive hunger), together with weight loss and blurred vision. Loss of pain sensation predisposes Diabetes mellitus, commonly known as diabetes or diabetus, is a group of common endocrine diseases characterized by sustained high blood sugar levels. If left untreated, the disease can lead to many health complications, including disorders of the cardiovascular system, eye, kidney, and nerves 5a3901629b

ICD-11 The ICD is developed and annually updated by the World Health Organization (WHO). Following an alpha version in May 2011 and a beta draft in May 2012, a stable version of the ICD-11 was released on 18 June 2018, and officially endorsed by all WHO members during the 72nd World Health Assembly on 28 May 2019. It replaces the ICD-10 as the global standard for recording The ICD-11 is the eleventh revision of the International Classification of Diseases (ICD). Development of the ICD-11 started in 2007 and spanned over a decade of work, involving over 300 specialists from 55 countries divided into 30 work groups, with an additional 10,000 proposals from people all over the world. The ICD-11 is a large ontology consisting of about 85,000 entities, also called classes or nodes. An entity can be anything that is relevant to health care. It usually represents a disease or a pathogen, but it can also be an isolated symptom or (developmental) anomaly of the body. There are also classes for reasons for contact with health services, social circumstances of the patient, and external causes of injury or death. These factors can be categorized as vascular, neurological, local penile, hormonal, and drug-induced. Notable predictors of ED include aging, cardiovascular disease, diabetes mellitus, high blood pressure, obesity, abnormal lipid levels in the blood, hypogonadism, smoking, depression, and medication use. Approximately 10% of cases are linked to psychosocial factors, encompassing conditions such as depression, stress, and problems within relationships. ED is reported in 18% of males aged 50 to 59 years, and 37% in males aged 70 to 75. 5a3901629b REM sleep behavior disorder (RBD)—in which people lose the muscle paralysis (atonia) that normally occurs during REM sleep and act out their dreams—is a core feature. RBD may appear years or decades before other symptoms. Other core features are visual hallucinations, marked fluctuations in attention or alertness, and parkinsonism (slowness of movement, trouble walking, or rigidity). A presumptive diagnosis can be made if several disease features or biomarkers are present; the diagnostic workup may include blood tests, neuropsychological... 5a3901629b Medicalisation is defined as a process of conceptualizing, defining, and treating nonmedical issues as medical problems. Human sexual activity is affected by many factors, including social norms, sexual identity and gender identity, and relationship structures. Sexuality is the way people experience and express themselves sexually. Much research in psychology and psychiatry has been devoted to understanding factors contributing to human sexuality, often playing a gatekeeping or legislative role in stigmatising certain behavior or promoting disease mongering. The medicalisation of sexuality has also been used to advance the pharmaceutical industry through treatments for erectile dysfunction and female sexual dysfunction. Another key influence of the medicalisation of sexuality is social control, mass surveillance and regulation related to risk profiling for medicalised sexual... 5a3901629b The initialism BDSM is first recorded in a Usenet post from 1991, and is interpreted as a combination of the abbreviations B/D (Bondage and Discipline), D/s (Dominance and submission), and S/M (Sadism and Masochism). BDSM is used as a catch-all phrase covering a wide range of activities, forms of interpersonal relationships, and distinct subcultures. BDSM communities generally welcome anyone with a non-normative streak who identifies with the community; this may include the leather subculture, body modification enthusiasts, animal roleplayers, rubber fetishists, and many others. 5a3901629b It was first described in four siblings in 1938 by Dr. Don J. Wolfram, M.D. In 1995, diagnostic criteria were created based on the profiles of 45 patients. The disease affects the central nervous system (especially the brainstem). Wolfram syndrome is caused by pathogenic variants (mutations) in one of two genes — WFS1 or CISD2 — with the majority of patients carrying mutations in the WFS1 gene. The first causative gene for Wolfram syndrome, WFS1, was discovered by Dr. M. Alan Permutt, M.D. at Washington University in St. Louis. Wolfram syndrome was subsequently established as a prototype endoplasmic reticulum disorder caused by dysregulated unfolded protein response by Dr. Fumihiko Urano, M.D., Ph.D. at Washington University in St. Louis. 5a3901629b PNH is the only hemolytic anemia caused by an acquired (rather than inherited) intrinsic defect in the cell membrane (deficiency of glycosphosphatidylinositol or GPI) leading to the absence of protective exterior surface proteins that normally attach via a GPI anchor.
