Cluster headache Cluster headaches are unique in their periodicity and regularity: the headaches occur at around the same hour every day during a cluster period, which typically lasts 8–10 weeks a year. Between cluster periods are pain-free intervals without headaches, which last a little less than one year, but some patients can have chronic cluster headaches without remission periods. **Nerve Cluster headache** is a neurological disorder characterized by episodes of severe headaches on one side of the head, typically around the eye and temple, lasting between 15 minutes to three hours. recommended to decrease the frequency of attacks include steroid injections, galcanezumab, civamide, verapamil, or oral glucocorticoids such as prednisone. Episodes are often accompanied by eye watering, nasal congestion, drooping eyelids, or swelling around the eye on the affected side. The underlying cause is unknown, but may include a genetic component, as a family history of migraines increases risk. Radiology can show damage to the lungs, which has a characteristic "ground glass" appearance. Bronchoscopy shows chronic inflammation, with biopsies showing lymphocytosis and granulomatous tissue. BFL may be treated with steroids such as prednisone to reduce inflammation, and removal of exposure to avian proteins. Bird fancier's lung of tissue damage differ among similar diseases, as does response to treatment with prednisone. It is triggered by exposure to avian proteins present in the dry dust of droppings or feathers of a variety of birds. It mostly affects people who work with birds or own many birds. The lungs become inflamed, with granuloma formation. Up to 12% of x-rays may show no damage, whilst only 2% of Bird fancier's lung (BFL), also known as bird breeder's lung or pigeon lung, is a type of hypersensitivity pneumonitis. A common lasting effect of JDM is childhood arthritis Juvenile dermatomyositis (JDM) is an idiopathic inflammatory myopathy (IMM) of presumed autoimmune dysfunction resulting in muscle weakness among other complications. The UK incidence is believed to be between 2-3 per million children per year, with some difference between ethnic groups. In JDM, the body's immune

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system attacks blood vessels throughout the body, causing inflammation called vasculitis. It manifests itself in children; it is the pediatric counterpart of dermatomyositis. In the United States, the incidence rate of JDMS is approximately 2-3 cases per million children per year. Naproxen is a nonselective COX inhibitor. As an NSAID, naproxen appears to exert its anti-inflammatory action by reducing the production of inflammatory mediators called prostaglandins. 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dexamethasone are sometimes administered to attenuate the immune response and prevent long-term skin damage. Management of chronic headaches In addition, dietary alteration and behavioral therapy or psychological therapy are other possible treatments for chronic headaches. However, medical professionals advise that abuse of analgesics and abortive medications can actually lead to an increase. Chronic headache, or chronic daily headache (CDH), is classified as experiencing fifteen or more days with a headache per month. Suggested treatments for chronic headaches include medication, physical therapy, acupuncture, relaxation training, and biofeedback. Some treatments are controversial and are still being tested for effectiveness. Multiple sources recommend multimodal treatment, which is a combination of medicinal and non-medicinal remedies. (Imitrex), and prednisone (Deltasone). The treatments for chronic headache are vast and varied. Whether pharmacological or not, treatment plans are often created on an individual basis. Medicinal and non-medicinal methods exist to help patients cope with chronic headache, because chronic headaches cannot be cured. Chronic headaches consist of different sub-groups, primarily categorized as chronic tension-type headaches and chronic migraine headaches. Naproxen It is available in immediate and delayed release formulations. formulations (sometimes called "sustained release", or "enteric coated",) take longer to take effect than the immediate-release formulations and therefore are less Naproxen, sold under the brand name Aleve among others, is a nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID) used to treat pain, menstrual cramps, and inflammatory diseases such as rheumatoid arthritis, gout and fever. It is taken orally. Naproxen is also available in salt form, naproxen sodium, which has better solubility when taken orally. Onset of effects is within an hour and lasts for up to twelve hours 48a5b22010

Common side effects include dizziness, headache, bruising, allergic reactions, heartburn, and stomach pain. Severe side effects include an increased risk of heart disease, stroke, gastrointestinal bleeding, and stomach ulcers. The heart disease risk may be lower than with other NSAIDs. It is not recommended in people with kidney problems. Use is not recommended in the third trimester of pregnancy.

Adrenal insufficiency The adrenal glands—also referred to as the adrenal cortex—normally secrete glucocorticoids (primarily cortisol), mineralocorticoids (primarily aldosterone), and androgens. Adrenal crisis may occur if a person having adrenal insufficiency experiences stresses, such as an accident, injury, surgery, or severe infection; this is a life-threatening medical condition resulting from severe deficiency of cortisol in the body. Deficiency of these hormones leads to symptoms ranging from abdominal pain, vomiting, muscle weakness and fatigue, low blood pressure, depression, mood and personality changes (in mild cases) to organ failure and shock (in severe cases) 48a5b22010

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Statin-associated autoimmune myopathy However, there are cases of SAAM in patients who have not taken statin medication, and this can be explained by the exposure to natural sources of statin such as red yeast rice, which is statin rich. This theory is supported by the higher prevalence of statin-naïve SAAM patients in Asian cohorts, who have statin-rich diets. For a 70 kg (154 lb) human, approximately four grams of dissolved glucose (also called "blood glucose") is maintained in the blood plasma at all times. Glucose that is not circulating in the blood is stored in skeletal muscle and liver cells in the form of glycogen; in fasting individuals, blood glucose is maintained at a constant level by releasing just enough glucose from these glycogen stores in the liver and skeletal muscle in order to maintain homeostasis. Glucose can be transported from the intestines or liver to other tissues in the body via the bloodstream. Cellular glucose uptake is primarily regulated by insulin, a hormone produced in the pancreas. Once inside the cell, the glucose can now act as an energy source as it undergoes the process of glycolysis. 48a5b22010

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
