== Medical uses == β -adrenergic receptors are found on cells of the heart muscles, smooth muscles, airways, arteries, kidneys, and other tissues that are part of the sympathetic nervous system and lead to stress responses, especially when they are stimulated by epinephrine (adrenaline). Beta blockers interfere with the binding to the receptor of epinephrine... Common side effects include chest pain, dizziness, dry mouth, and tingling. Other side effects may include myocardial infarction, stroke, high blood pressure, serotonin syndrome, and anaphylaxis. Excessive use may result in medication overuse headaches. Use is not recommended during pregnancy and breastfeeding is not recommended within 24 hours after taking a dose. Rizatriptan is in the triptan class and is believed to work by activating the 5-HT₁ receptor.

Rizatriptan It is taken by mouth. receptor agonist (triptan). It can also be applied on the tongue. Common side effects include chest pain, dizziness, dry mouth, and tingling. It is a serotonin (5-HT) 1B/1D receptor agonist (triptan). Other side effects may include myocardial infarction Rizatriptan, sold under the brand name Maxalt among others, is a medication used for the treatment of migraine headaches

Acute myocardial infarction in high-risk patients Beta blockers are competitive antagonists that block the receptor sites for the endogenous catecholamines epinephrine (adrenaline) and norepinephrine (noradrenaline) on adrenergic beta receptors, of the sympathetic nervous system, which mediates the fight-or-flight response. Common side effects include nausea, abdominal pain, and constipation. It may worsen the symptoms of asthma. Propranolol may cause harmful effects for the fetus if taken during pregnancy; however, its use during breastfeeding is generally considered to be safe. It is a non-selective beta blocker which works by blocking β -adrenergic receptors. It was patented in 1971 and approved for medical use in 1981. It is available as a generic medication. In 2023, isosorbide was the 125th most commonly prescribed medication in the United States, with more than 5 million prescriptions. == Medical uses == Adrenergic ligands are endogenous proteins that modulate and evoke specific cardiovascular effects. Adrenergic antagonists reverse the natural cardiovascular effect, based on the type of adrenoreceptor being blocked. For example, if the natural activation of the α ₁-adrenergic receptor leads to vasoconstriction, an α ₁-adrenergic antagonist will result in vasodilation. == Diagnosis ==

They include movement dysfunction such as dystonia (continuous spasms and muscle contractions), akathisia (may manifest as motor restlessness), parkinsonism characteristic symptoms such as rigidity, bradykinesia (slowness of movement), tremor, and tardive dyskinesia (irregular, jerky movements). Diffuse neonatal hemangiomatosis decades for the treatment of hypertension and arrhythmias, with less attention on treatment of IH. Adrenergic antagonist The second group contains the alpha (α) adrenoreceptors. Adrenergic receptors are located near the heart, kidneys, lungs, and gastrointestinal tract. There are β_1 , β_2 , and β_3 receptors. Two examples of competitive adrenergic antagonists are propranolol and phentolamine. The first group of receptors are the beta (β) adrenergic receptors. Phentolamine An adrenergic antagonist is a drug that inhibits the function of adrenergic receptors. There are five adrenergic receptors, which are divided into two groups. Discovery and development of beta-blockers Propranolol became the first major drug in the treatment of angina pectoris, since the introduction of coronary vasodilators β adrenergic receptor antagonists (also called beta-blockers or β -blockers) were initially developed in the 1960s, for the treatment of angina pectoris but are now also used for hypertension, congestive heart failure and certain arrhythmias. In the 1950s, dichloroisoproterenol (DCI) was discovered to be a β -antagonist that blocked the effects of sympathomimetic amines on bronchodilation, uterine relaxation and heart stimulation. pronethalol, with fewer side effects. Although DCI had no clinical utility, a change in the compound did provide a clinical candidate, pronethalol, which was introduced in 1962 a356f78869

Propranolol It can be taken orally, rectally, or by intravenous injection. versions. The formulation that is taken orally comes in short-acting and long-acting versions. It is used to treat high blood pressure, some types of irregular heart rate, thyrotoxicosis, capillary hemangiomas, akathisia, performance anxiety, and essential tremors, as well as to prevent migraine headaches, and to prevent further heart problems in those with angina or previous heart attacks. 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Isosorbide mononitrate is a nitrate-class drug used for the prevention of angina pectoris. The sublingual patch has an onset of five minutes and a duration of action of one hour. The oral, slow release tablet has an onset of thirty minutes, and a duration of 8 hours.

Alprenolol It is no longer marketed by AstraZeneca, but may still be available from other pharmaceutical companies or generically.
