During this initial period, Isoniazid is taken alongside pyridoxal phosphate to obviate peripheral neuropathy. Isoniazid is then taken concurrently with rifampicin for the remaining four months of treatment (6-8 months for miliary tuberculosis). A patient is expected to be free from all living TB bacteria after six months of therapy in Pulmonary TB or 8-10 months in Miliary TB. 6ce2617598

Carbapenem-resistant enterobacteriaceae Enterobacteriaceae are common gastrointestinal commensals and infectious agents. Tom Frieden, former head of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has referred to CRE as "Nightmare bacteria". Experts fear CRE as the new "superbug". They are resistant because they produce an enzyme called a carbapenemase that disables the drug molecule. The bacteria can kill up to half of patients who get bloodstream infections. KPC and NDM are enzymes that break down carbapenems and make them ineffective. Examples of enzymes found in certain types of CRE are KPC (*Klebsiella pneumoniae* carbapenemase) and NDM (New Delhi Metallo-beta-lactamase). coli from the sputum sample of a patient admitted to

a Beijing hospital was found to acquire resistance to carbapenem through Carbapenem-resistant Enterobacteriaceae (CRE) or carbapenemase-producing Enterobacteriaceae (CPE) are gram-negative bacteria that are resistant to the carbapenem class of antibiotics, considered the drugs of last resort for such infections. The resistance can vary from moderate to severe. Both of these enzymes, as well as the enzyme VIM (Verona Integron-Mediated Metallo- β -lactamase) have also been reported in *Pseudomonas*. Phagocyte One litre of human blood contains about six billion phagocytes. Discovered in 2019, species of bacteria *Candidatus Uabimicrobium amorphum* can perform phagocytosis by eating other bacteria. They were discovered in 1882 by Ilya Ilyich Mechnikov while he was studying starfish larvae. They are essential for fighting infections and for subsequent immunity. They include monocytes, macrophages, neutrophils, tissue

dendritic cells, and mast cells. Phagocytes are important throughout the animal kingdom and are highly developed within vertebrates. Mechnikov was awarded the 1908 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine for his discovery. pigment, which accounts for the green color of secretions rich in neutrophils, such as pus and infected sputum. Their name comes from the Greek phagein, "to eat" or "devour", and "-cyte", the suffix in biology denoting "cell", from the Greek kutos, "hollow vessel". Phagocytes can also kill microbes by oxygen-independent Phagocytes are cells that protect the body by ingesting harmful foreign particles, bacteria, and dead or dying cells. Phagocytes occur in many species; some amoebae behave like macrophage phagocytes, which suggests that phagocytes appeared early in the evolution of life 6ce2617598
