A style guide establishes standard style requirements to improve communication by ensuring consistency within and across documents. They may require certain best practices in writing style, usage, language composition, visual composition, orthography, and typography by setting standards of usage in areas such as punctuation, capitalization, citing sources, formatting of numbers and dates, table appearance and other areas. For academic and technical documents, a guide may also enforce best practices in ethics (such as authorship, research ethics, and disclosure) and compliance (technical and regulatory). For translations, a style guide may even be used to enforce consistent grammar, tone, and localization decisions such as units of measure.

Several basic style guides for technical and scientific communication have been defined by international standards organizations. These are often used as elements of and refined in more specialized style guides that are specific to a subject, region, or organization. Some examples are:

There are several ways to add a reference to a library: manually, or by exporting, importing, copying from another EndNote library, or connecting from EndNote. When manually creating a reference, the program presents the user with a window containing a dropdown menu from which to select the type of reference they require (e.g., book, journal article, film, newspaper article, etc.), and fields ranging from the general (author, title, year) to those specific to the kind of reference (abstract, author, ISBN, running time, etc.)

APA style

It is described in the style guide of the American Psychological Association (APA), titled the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association. The current edition is its seventh revision. It is commonly used for citing sources within the field of behavioral and social sciences, including sociology, education, nursing, criminal justice, anthropology, and psychology. It is commonly

APA style (also known as APA format) is a writing style and format for academic documents such as scholarly journal articles and books. The guidelines were developed to aid reading comprehension in the social and behavioral sciences, for clarity of communication, and for "word choice that best reduces bias in language". APA style is widely used, either entirely or with modifications, by hundreds of other scientific journals, in many textbooks, and in academia (for papers written in classes). APA style (also known as APA format) is a writing style and format for academic documents such as scholarly journal articles and books

Parenthetical referencing

Parenthetical referencing can be used in lieu of footnote citations or the numbered Vancouver system. In the natural sciences and social sciences, espoused by systems such as APA style; Author–title or author–page: primarily used in the arts and the humanities

Parenthetical referencing is a citation system in which in-text citations are made using parentheses. They are usually accompanied by a full, alphabetized list of citations in an end section, usually titled "references", "reference list", "works cited", or "end-text citations"

EndNote groups citations into "libraries" with the file extension *.enl and a corresponding *.data folder.

Bible citation

Subsequent citations do not require the translation unless that changes. There are several formats for doing so. In APA 7th edition, the Bible is listed in the references at the end of the document, A citation from the Bible is usually referenced with the book name, chapter number and verse number. Sometimes, the name of the Bible translation is also included

The work is often referred to as "Turabian" (after the work's original author, Kate L. Turabian) or by the shortened title, A Manual for Writers. The style and formatting of academic works, described within the manual, is commonly referred to as "Turabian style" or "Chicago style" (being based on that of The Chicago Manual of Style).

Author–date (also known as Harvard referencing): primarily used in the natural sciences and social sciences, espoused by systems such as APA style;

Standard word spaces were about one-third of an em space, but sentences were to be divided by a full em-space. With the arrival of the typewriter in the late 19th century, style guides for writers began diverging from printer's manuals, indicating that writers should double-space between sentences. This held for most of the 20th century until the computer began replacing the typewriter as the primary means of creating text. In the 1990s, style guides reverted to recommending a single-space between sentences. However, instead of a slightly larger sentence space, style guides simply indicated a standard word space. This is now the convention for publishers. faab22b5b0

EndNote's main competitors are Mendeley and Zotero. fields, EndNote can automatically format the citation into any of over 7,000 different styles the user chooses.
