

Side Effects From Propofol

Ciprofol is an optically active 2,6-disubstituted alkylphenol with a cyclopropylethyl group incorporated at the second carbon atom. This cyclopropyl group increases the steric effects and introduces stereoselective effects over its anesthetic properties. These properties appear to increase the anesthetic potency of ciprofol, when compared with propofol. Side effects can include a decrease in efforts to breathe, low blood pressure, and sleepiness. Tolerance to its effects and withdrawal syndrome may occur following long-term use. Paradoxical effects, such as increased activity, can occur especially in children and older people. There is evidence of risk when used during pregnancy but no evidence of harm with a single dose during breastfeeding.

Midazolam Side effects can include a decrease in efforts to breathe, low blood pressure, and sleepiness. It induces sleepiness, decreases anxiety, and causes anterograde amnesia. Tolerance to its effects and withdrawal Midazolam, sold under the brand name Versed among others, is a benzodiazepine medication used for anesthesia, premedication before surgical anesthesia, and procedural sedation, and to treat severe agitation

== See also == This technique is often used in the emergency department for the performance of painful or uncomfortable procedures. Common purposes include: It was tested up to Phase II human trials, but while it produced less respiratory depression than propofol, it had a longer recovery time and was deemed not to have any significant advantages over the older drug. Similarly when Ro48-6791 was compared to midazolam, it had similar efficacy, higher potency and a shorter recovery time, but produced less of a synergistic effect on opioid-induced analgesia and produced more severe side effects such as dizziness after the procedure. Consequently, it was dropped from clinical development, although it is still used in scientific research. TIVA is maintained by intravenous infusion devices and assisted by electroencephalography (EEG) monitoring. These techniques facilitate the use of propofol, etomidate, ketamine, and other intravenous anesthetic agents. During or after TIVA, patients may be subjected to an elevated risk of anesthesia awareness, hyperalgesia and neurotoxicity. Considering these risks, special consideration is given to obese, elderly and pediatric patients. Using a drug or other medical intervention which is contraindicated may increase the risk of adverse effects. Adverse effects may cause complications of a disease or procedure and negatively affect its prognosis. They may also lead to non-compliance with a treatment regimen. Adverse effects of medical treatment resulted in 142,000 deaths in 2013 up from 94,000 deaths in 1990 globally. Compared to other anesthetics, recovery from propofol-induced anesthesia is generally quick and infrequently associated with such side effects as drowsiness, nausea, vomiting. Propofol may be used before diagnostic procedures requiring anesthesia, in the management of refractory status epilepticus, and for induction or maintenance of anesthesia

before and during surgery. It may be administered as a bolus or an infusion, or as a combination of the two. f986ab07ce

Propofol recovery from propofol-induced anesthesia is generally quick and infrequently associated with such side effects as drowsiness, nausea, vomiting. Propofol may be the active component of an intravenous anesthetic used for induction and maintenance of general anesthesia. Propofol was first marketed under the brand name Diprivan. Intravenous administration is used to induce unconsciousness, after which anesthesia may be maintained using a combination of medications. Propofol is manufactured as part of a sterile injectable emulsion using soybean oil and lecithin, which gives it a white milky color f986ab07ce

Coinduction (anesthetics) The onset or induction phase of anesthesia is a critical period involving the loss of consciousness and reactivity in the patient, and is arguably the most dangerous period of a general anesthetic. fentanyl which has a fast onset, then an intravenous induction agent: propofol. Coinduction is used in human medicine and veterinary medicine as standard practice to provide optimum anesthetic induction. A muscle relaxant such as atracurium would be administered after this. Coinduction in anesthesia is a pharmacological tool whereby a combination of sedative drugs may be used to greater effect than a single agent, achieving a smoother onset of general anesthesia. A great variety of coinduction combinations are in use and selection is dependent on the patient's age and health, the specific situation, and the indication for anesthesia. As with all forms of anesthesia the resources available in the environment are a key factor. The use of coinduction allows lower doses of the same anesthetic agents to be used which provides enhanced safety, faster recovery, fewer side-effects, and more predictable pharmacodynamics f986ab07ce

Cipecpofol When compared with propofol, side effects such as pain on injection and respiratory depression appear to be Cipecpofol (INNTooltip International Nonproprietary Name, USANTooltip United States Adopted Name), also known as ciprofol or by its developmental code name HSK3486, sold under the brand name Cypsedo, is a general anesthetic related to propofol which is used for anesthesia and sedation. A short-acting and highly selective GABAA positive allosteric modulator, ciprofol is 4 to 6 times more potent than other phenol derivatives such as propofol or fospropofol. The drug is used by intravenous infusion. inflammation and apoptosis of cardiac muscle cells f986ab07ce

In May 2026, cipepofol was approved by the US FDA. Manufactured by Haisco Pharmaceutical Group of Chengdu, Sichuan, China, ciprofol underwent phase I and II trials in Australia and China. Procedural sedation and analgesia 40 seconds for the effects of propofol to kick in, and effects last six minutes. The overall goal is to induce a decreased level of consciousness while maintaining the patient's ability to breathe on their own. Propofol has both sedative and amnestic effects, but provides no analgesia Procedural sedation and analgesia (PSA) is a technique in which a sedating/dissociative medication is given, usually along with an analgesic medication, in order to perform non-surgical procedures on a patient. While PSA is considered safe and has low rates of complication, it is important to conduct a pre-procedural assessment, determine any contraindications to PSA, choose the most appropriate sedative agent, and monitor the patient for potential complications both during and after the procedure. PSA is commonly used in the emergency department, in addition to the operating room f986ab07ce

Ro48-6791 was developed as an alternative to the short-acting imidazobenzodiazepine midazolam, for use in induction of anaesthesia and conscious sedation for minor invasive procedures. Ro48-6791 has properties similar to those of midazolam, being water-soluble, with a fast onset and short duration of action. It is 4-6x more potent than midazolam, and slightly shorter acting, and produces similar side effects such as sedation and amnesia. f986ab07ce A standard coinduction regimen for an adult might consist of a benzodiazepine sedative amnesic such as midazolam, followed by an opioid analgesic with further sedating properties such as... f986ab07ce

Midazolam can be given by mouth, intravenously, by injection into a muscle, by spraying into the nose, or through the cheek.
