Alaska moose While males and females are spatially separate the habitat that they occupy is not significantly different. This leads to spatial segregation throughout much of the year. Typically, they only come into contact with other moose for mating or competition for mates. The rut is characterized in males by an increase in testosterone, exaggerated sexual dimorphisms, increased aggression, as well as increased interest in females. The males of the species may mark themselves with mud, undergo physiological changes or perform characteristic displays in order to make themselves more visually appealing to the females

== History == Large and medium sized mammals Hunting shaped the relationship between moose and humans, both in Eurasia and North America. Prior to the early modern period (around 1600–1700), moose were one of many valuable sources of sustenance for certain North American Indians. Hunting and habitat loss have reduced the moose's range; this fragmentation has led to sightings of "urban moose" in some areas. The moose has been reintroduced to some of its former habitats. Currently, the greatest populations occur in Canada. Additionally, During the rut (known as the rutting period and in domestic sheep management as tugging), males often rub their antlers or horns on trees or shrubs, fight with each other, wallow in mud or dust,

self-anoint, and herd estrus females together.
