The regatta lasts for six days (Tuesday to Sunday) ending on the

first weekend in July. Events are head-to-head knock out competitions, raced upstream over a course of 1 mile and 550yds, or 2,112m. The regatta regularly attracts international crews to race. Winklevoss co-founded HarvardConnection (later renamed ConnectU) along with his identical twin brother Cameron Winklevoss and a Harvard classmate of theirs, Divya Narendra

It was established on 26 March 1839. It differs from the three other regattas rowed over approximately the same course, Henley Women's Regatta, Henley Masters Regatta, and Henley Town and Visitors' Regatta, each of which is an entirely separate event
