The writer revisits the scene to note details and emotions, reflect on meaning, examine what went well or revealed a need for additional learning, and relate what transpired to the rest of life. Reflective practice A key rationale for reflection is that deliberate reflection on experience is essential for engaging in meaningful action. "Gibbs's suggestions are often cited as "Gibbs's reflective cycle" or "Gibbs's model of reflection";, and simplified Reflective practice is the ability to reflect on one's thoughts, emotions, actions, decisions, assumptions, and professional experiences so as to take a critical stance or attitude towards improving one's own practice, understanding, judgment, and future actions, while challenging automatic reactions and assumptions and engaging in a process of continuous adaptation and learning. According to one definition it involves "paying critical attention to the practical values and theories which inform everyday actions, by examining practice reflectively and reflexively.
