Trap-neuter-return Feral cats cannot be socialized, shun most human interaction and do not fare well in confinement, so they are not retained. Implementation of TNR is often also accompanied with the introduction of new laws that prevent land owners from removing feral cats from their properties, as well as protection from liability for people that feed and release feral cats. Cats suffering from severe medical problems such as terminal, contagious, or untreatable illnesses or injuries are often euthanized. Often, friendly adults and kittens young enough to be easily socialized are retained and placed for adoption.
